Concerned Citizens of Waller County - Update on Texas HB 5685 and Proposed Theme Park

Texas House Bill 5685 was introduced to the Texas State Legislature on April 22, 2025. The Bill would allow the

creation of the Waller County Improvement District No.3; providing authority to issue bonds; providing authority to impose assessments, fees, and

A notice to this effect was published in the Houston Chronicle on March 20, 2025.

Please note that the noriease note that the no-tice was NOT published lo-cally in Waller County. The notice was paid for by Tex-asLand USA, LLC who, according to their website, wish to create a large Texas-themed amusement park. The creation of the special district gives the developer full autonomy, the ability to expand the district, and the ability to divert public tax dollars to the benefit of the theme park.

As a result of Waller County citizens calls regarding lack of transparency and notice, on Thursday, May 13, 2025, Texas State Representative Stan Kitzman's office, issued the following statement:

"The landowners associated with the proposed Waller County Improvement District No. 3 have asked me to with-draw House Bill 5685. They believe additional time needed to share accurate infor-mation about the project and how a proposed district would

function" This withdrawal effectively tables the bill, per House of Representative Chamber History Notes - Recommendations filed with the Speaker.

However, the bill cannot

officially be considered dead until the end of the legislative session which ends June 22nd. If Governor Abbot calls for a special session, HB5685 in its current form can be reintroduced and considered anew. So, it is not over.

The developer, city and county officials have not given Waller County citizens any further notice or information regarding HB 5685, nor the proposed theme park. There has been no transparency on either issue.
