Peaceful Ponderings...

It was 2012 or 2013. We had moved to New Hampshire and John was working at Dartmouth College. There weren't lots of Lutheran congregations there, and I had the fun of connecting with St. Thomas Episcopal Church in Hanover. I served as the Assisting Priest, and as the Episcopal Chaplain at the hospital there. One of my favorite memories centers around Reformation Day. I discovered that Episcopalians don't do Reformation Day. (Their "reformation" had more to do with King Henry VIII's succession concerns than problems in the church.)

When I asked about celebrating Reformation Day at St. Thomas, the rector got on board. It would have been a bit much to do my Katie Luther sermon (complete with costume). I didn't want to scare them off. But I did preach about the Lutheran Reformation. And, yes, we sang "A Mighty Fortress." It was a lot of fun, and my impression was that people learned a lot. For them, Luther was someone new and different.

The celebration of Reformation Day in our Lutheran tradition is important in many ways. It reminds us of our identity - as descendants of a radical understanding of grace. It reminds us, as well, of our call. To continue living in that grace.

Luther nailed the 95 Theses on the wall of the Castle Church in Wittenberg in 1517. They were a call to discussion of things in the church that he believed were unfaithful understandings of God's work in Christ. The ensuing reformation was a radical transformation of the Church.

Is the church again—or still—in need of transformation? Is each one of us again—or still—in need of transformation? The answer is a hearty "yes!" Reformation of the church was not completed with the nails pounded in the door in 1517. Nor was it complete with Luther's death in 1546. Reformation is ongoing. It is something to which we are still called, today, as we wrestle with what it is to be a faithful expression of God's love in Christ in the midst of a changing and challenging world.

Luther "nailed it." I think we are called to continue the Reformation. Let's "nail it!", siblings in Christ.

(Reminder: one of my other favorite church festival days, All Saints, follows on the heels of Reformation Day. You'll hear more next month, but be reminded that you are invited to bring a photograph of a beloved 'saint' to display. Also, following worship, we will have a time for those who have lost loved ones to share thoughts, stories and grief.)


The holidays are fast approaching and we have asked for a family for Christmas from TLC. We will receive our family information by October 15th.

All are welcome to join in!


Women's Mid-Day Gathering
