Peaceful Ponderings...

From Pastor Carol...

This afternoon - Monday, January 26 - two days after the death in Minneapolis of Alex Petti at the hands of ICE agents, I reread the article I wrote last week and decided it was not relevant to the realities we are facing. Before tackling this rewrite, I attended an Interfaith Prayer Vigil at City Hall in Milwaukee.



At the vigil, we prayed for Renee Good and Alex Petti, for their families and friends. We prayed for all who live in fear of immigration officials: parents who fear being torn from their children, and for children terrified of their parents being torn from them. We prayed for all who step up to protect and care for these people, and for all those who stand up in protest. We prayed even for federal agents who inflict harm and engender fear, that they might understand better what love is, and do their jobs with integrity and respect.

Prayers were offered by people from diverse faith traditions: Baptists - both American and Progressive, Roman Catholics, Episcopalian, and United Church of Christ. Prayers were offered by a Jewish man who became a naturalized citizen several years ago, and by Buddhist and Sikh leaders. The Bishop of our Greater Milwaukee Synod of the ELCA, Paul Erickson, was one of the final speakers. The Bishop led a litany to renounce evil in all its forms.

Consistent through the vigil were these reminders from our faith traditions: we are all created in the Image of God; we are all loved - regardless of color, language, abilities, or country of origin; we are called and challenged to love God and to love our neighbors as ourselves; all deserve to be treated with respect and dignity.

From our American history we were reminded of the words of the Declaration of Independence: *We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.*

Near the end of the many eloquent and powerful prayers we were invited to hold candles high. There is light in the world. The darkness has not overcome the light. There is hope. We are the ones called in our communities to carry the light to those who see only darkness.

What is needed in Burlington and Waterford, my sisters and brothers? How can we bring light to those who live in the darkness of fear?

Lent

Ash Wednesday

We will gather on Ash Wednesday, February 18, at 6:00 p.m. to mark the beginning of the Lenten season. We are working to make worship accessible to all. If you are uncomfortable driving in the dark, please contact Renee Knapton for a ride. Or, you are welcome to join us on Zoom.

Midweek Lenten Worship: Wednesdays

During the 40 days of Lent, in addition to preparing for Easter, we have the opportunity to reflect on our own lives and expand our hearts and minds through intentional spiritual work. The 40 days of Lent echo the story of the days between Jesus' baptism and the beginning of his public ministry. Driven into the wilderness and tempted by Satan, Jesus learned more deeply what it meant to be the beloved son of God - the one with whom God is 'well-pleased.'

This Lenten season, in addition to Sunday worship, we have the opportunity to look more closely at ourselves, at what God is calling us to be and what seems to be holding us back or getting in the way. Each Wednesday we will have a 30 minutes worship/devotional time, from 1:00 - 1:30. Drawing on scripture and parts of The Screwtape Letters written by C.S. Lewis, we will look at what gets in the way of our living faithful, fruitful and joyful lives. You may enjoy reading The Screwtape Letters as we move through Lent. Each Wednesday's devotion is preceded by a potluck soup luncheon that begins at noon. You can sign up in the narthex to bring soup and sides for lunch.

In order to make the Wednesday devotions accessible to all - including those who work during the day - we are hoping to make them available through recording and/or Zoom. If you can help with this, please contact Bev Stobber, Worship Chairperson.

Sundays

As we move with Jesus through Lent this year, the gospel lessons move from Jesus in the wilderness to his encounters with Nicodemus, the Pharisee and the Samaritan woman at the well. We will hear of the reaction to the healing of the man born blind, and the death and raising of Lazarus. Finally, on Passion Sunday, we will move from the joy of Jesus entry into Jerusalem, to his last supper with his disciples, his betrayal, arrest and crucifixion. Easter morning, we celebrate the resurrection. We look forward to sharing this journey with you.

After Worship

Following worship each Sunday during Lent, we will explore Christian Nationalism. We will consider a number of questions, including: Was America founded as a Christian nation? What does Christian nationalism look like in the United States? Is there a difference between conservative Christianity and Christian nationalism? Pastor Carol will be leading these discussions. This is a difficult yet important issue in our time and our country. As followers of Jesus, it is crucial that we understand ways in which the faith is being distorted and discern ways in which we can stand up to the distortions.

Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services will be at 6:00 p.m. Again, we are working to make worship accessible to all. If you are uncomfortable driving in the dark, please contact Renee Knapton for a ride. Or, you are welcome to join us on Zoom.

Celebrating 50 Years of Ministry

Plans are underway for our anniversary celebration. On the last Sunday of each month, from May through October, we will remember and celebrate one decade of the congregation's life together.


Women's Mid-Day Gathering

The meeting was called to order at 10:22 a.m. by Vice President K. Christensen

Opening Prayer: Led by R. Knapton

Additions to Agenda : None

Approval of agenda : Motion by B. Stobber, seconded R. Knapton to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: 50th Anniversary celebration - Renee, Carol & Pastor will work on creating a large picture of what we want this celebration to look like. Sharon will check Time & Talent sheets to see who else indicated an interest in helping. Bev & Sharon will work on history. As part of our January agenda, need to evaluate our ministry together.

Secretary's Report (Sharon Ryd): Motion by C. Monsen, seconded by B. Stobber, to accept the minutes of the 11-9-25 council meeting. Motion carried.

Motion by C. Monsen, seconded by S. McGinty to accept the minutes for the 11-23-25 Congregational Budget meeting: Discussion- Sean suggested an amendment to remove the line in the minutes under "Expenses" related to "Payroll" for Pastor's contract amount. Instead, add separate line in minutes for this to read as "We formally added a line for Pastor's payroll to change it from conventional payroll to a contract payroll line". **Motion by B. Stobber, seconded by R. Knapton to accept the amended minutes of the 11-23-25 Congregational Budget meeting.** Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report (Sean McGinty): Deposits for the month of November were \$6731.00. Expenses were \$6351.40. The net balance for the month is \$379.60. Still waiting for bill for the new furnace. \$13,000 was transferred out of checking into the money market account. **Motion by R. Knapton seconded by C. Chaffe, to accept the treasurer's report as presented. Motion carried.**

- Ordered 8 poinsettias.
- Finishing up plans for Christmas Eve. service and 12/28 service of lessons & carols.

Faith Nurturing – Education (Chris Monsen): No report

Growing Relationships (Renee Knapton):

- Notices of prayers for Lynn Klein.
- Advent decorating done. Good feedback regarding decorating in 2 stages, Advent (blue theme) then Christmas.
- Still an interest in continuing the grief support throughout the year.

Caring for the Community – (Carol Chaffee):

- Library received 215 gloves, hats, socks.
- Christmas gifts for sponsored family will be delivered tomorrow.
- Many homeless behind Walmart & Menards. Would like to give backpacks to police station to deliver to them.

- February, Senior Center looking for paper cups, plates, napkins (not styrofoam).
- Bill & Elsie Goulding donated to Santa Chalet so Peace is listed as a sponsor.

- Helped decide to hold zoom worship on 11/30. Consensus was that it worked well, but next time keep everyone else muted and no video except Pastor. Need to look at music licensing if displaying music online. Offer assistance to any members who might want help setting up zoom for the future. Bev, Marilyn, Sean and Pastor will be the people to decide if worship will be cancelled or zoom.
- Special thanks to Knaptons and other helpers who did Advent decorating in spite of the snow.

Unfinished Business

- AED (Sharon) - we were approved for a grant, which would reduce our price from about \$2200 to \$1800, however this is still higher than budgeted amount. Other grants either not applicable for churches or not currently available. Researched refurbished AEDs. Good option because includes new battery & pads. Cost would be \$795 plus \$100 for 4 year warranty. Agreed to proceed with this option.
- Bibles for Sanctuary-Pastor & Sharon still need to look at this.

New Business

- Research/participate in Pray Without Ceasing? Consists of ELCA praying across the country once a week. No one expressed an interest.

The next meeting is scheduled for January 11, 2026

Kerry indicated that before she can apply for assistance from sponsors, the pantry needs to officially exist, we need a name for the pantry, need an individual in charge (Kerry) and need a Peace contact person.

Discussed possibility of Kwik Trip funds being used. Concerns addressed were about continuation and sustainability of the project, and would it take away from current outreach we are providing. Also questioned if this is something other agencies are already doing. Should the parameters of this be set by the council and not just Kerry? How can we make this a congregational project?

It was agreed we would like more information from Kerry before proceeding. A meeting was tentatively set for Saturday, January 10, 10:00a.m. if Kerry is available then.
