Jesus is Coming! Jesus is Coming!
Advent is Here.

Advent is a season of our church year that struggles with an identity crisis. Its earliest roots are in preparation for baptism at Epiphany. That preparation time was somber, penitential and serious. Over time, it became connected to the return of Christ and developed a strong emphasis on repentance. Eventually, it was connected to Christmas and Jesus' birth in Bethlehem. This understanding encourages preparation for the birth of Christ—allowing a more joyous preparation. So, is Advent a season of penitence? Of preparing for the second coming by making sure our lives are in order? Is it a time of preparing to celebrate Jesus' birthday?

Over my years in ministry I have struggled with the season. My first congregation was very proud of the series of Advent and Christmas banners. One arrived each week, telling the whole story. But the arrival of the wisemen on the first Sunday of Advent threw me. "Why"? I asked? "Because they had the farthest to travel to get to Bethlehem, of course!" Makes sense at one level, but it doesn't leave space to think of Advent as preparation for Christ's return as well as his birth.

No, there will be no wisemen at Peace on November 30. There will be decorations, but not the standard Christmas decorations. The tree will be there, but it will look fairly sparse. The primary color will be blue - the color of hope. As we move closer to Christmas, preparation for celebration of Jesus' birth will increase. But for the first half of Advent, we will focus more on the promise that Christ will return.

My hope is that this will help us stay focused on the amazing love of God - the God who entered into the world as a human, and who promises to never let us go.

Blessed Advent, people of God!

Thursday Morning Bible Study


This group will be meeting every other Thursday morning at 9:30 am. December dates are 12/4 and 12/18.

Church Council Meeting, October 12, 2025

Council Members Present: Ken Christensen, Marilyn Hart, Pastor Carol Jeunnette, Renee Knapton, Sean McGinty, Chris Monsen, Sharon Ryd, Bev Stobber.

The meeting was called to order at 10:18 a.m. by President M. Hart

Opening Prayer: Led by B. Stobber

Additions to Agenda: Under Unfinished Business, add discuss play structure.

Approval of agenda: Motion by B. Stobber, seconded R. Knapton to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report:

- Lead all services except Sept 21. Appreciated the weekend off to focus on completing edits of her book.
- Met with Lynn and Pam to discuss Parent Hope Project. Will purchase materials and meet again this Wednesday to begin training. Will contact Love Inc. to make sure there is no duplication of efforts.

Secretary's Report (Sharon Ryd) Motion by R. Knapton, seconded by S. McGinty, to accept the minutes of the September 14th council meeting. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report (Sean McGinty) Deposits for the month of September were \$6747.00. Expenses were \$6541.46. The net balance for the month is a positive \$205.54, year to date positive \$14,577.94. Motion by B. Stobber seconded by R. Knapton, to accept the treasurer's report as presented. Motion carried.

- Council members received 12 month snapshot of total finances, plus a summary of their particular area of responsibility. Each member should review and provide proposed budget information for 2026 before Oct. 31 so Sean can compile complete budget for council to vote on at November meeting.

Motion by S. McGinty to schedule congregational budget meeting on November 23, seconded by B. Stobber. Motion carried.

- Notice of congregational meeting must go in bulletin 2 Sundays prior, as well a separate email or regular mail 3 weeks in advance.

Nurturing the Faith – Worship (Bev Stobber)

- Reformation Sunday - Pastor will be dressed as Katie Luther. Renee will lead the first portion of worship and read the Gospel so Pastor can make an entrance for the sermon.
- All Saints Sunday - New candle set-up created by Chris & John with sand holding the candles in place. People will be invited to come forward throughout the service.

Faith Nurturing – Education (Chris Monsen)

- There will be no viewing of "The Chosen" on All Saints Sunday.
- New Thursday Bible Study-Jean will submit invoice for study materials.

Growing Relationships - (Renee Knapton)

- Notices sent out to congregation for events and prayers.
- Purchased thank you cards for Kerry, Elsie & Elaine. Will try to get as many member signatures as possible.
- Sent notice to go in Peacepipe/bulletin for Advent decorating Nov. 29 and will switch to Christmas decorating Dec. 14. Also need to convey special thanks for Elsie & Elaine's work changing out decorations for so long. It is a lot more work than most would realize.
- Renee will send out notice of Pastor's upcoming concert Nov. 9 by Milwaukee American Legion Band.

Caring for the Community and Inviting Folks In – (Carol Chaffee)

- Continued to send cards to congregation.
- Delivered food to Burlington Library cupboard and collecting mittens, socks & hats.
- Collecting cleaning supplies for TLC and items for Thanksgiving meals for Love Inc.
- We committed to buying Christmas gifts for TLC family.

Property Report – (Jim Hart)

- Stove and doorbell were repaired
- Replaced bad boards on playground equipment.
- Still need to get quotes to redo stones around building. Need to include money in budget for this.

Vice-President's Report - (Ken Christensen) - no report

President's Report - (Marilyn Hart)

- Prepared agenda for council meeting, compiled reports, sent out tasks from last meeting.
- Organized lunch for council retreat.
- Purchased & tested thin candles for All Saint's Day.

Unfinished Business

- We still need to decide on new AED. Sharon will research grants that may be available. Previous council vote was taken approving up to \$1500.
- It was decided to try and give away the playset entirely. Sharon will post on facebook.

New Business

- Synod benevolence needs to be paid out this month. Next year we will increase budget amount from \$2000 to \$3000 and review again at this time next year if we can make an additional payment. **Motion by S. McGinty to pay an additional \$1000 over \$2000 budget amount this year for synod benevolence, seconded by C. Monsen. Motion carried.**
- Pastor will mention during worship about discussion following All Saints service and will set it up downstairs.
- Synopsis of Oct. 11 council retreat - Discussed vision statement, All Saints, remaining feelings from past turmoils in our congregation, goals, stewardship, 50th anniversary celebration. Would like to dedicate our anniversary year to a special project/cause and we will continue to gather historical information. Pastor will come up with a sketch as to what this year-long celebration may look like.

The next meeting is scheduled for November 9, 2025

Motion to adjourn made by S. McGinty, seconded by B. Stobber. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:59 am.
