I am happy to be back at Peace. My return is not something I anticipated, but it is something I welcome with joy. As a faith community, your love for one another, your commitment and perseverance are praiseworthy. John and I are looking forward to being part of your congregation.

Although you probably have heard about the commitments the Council and I have made as we move forward together, I want to share them with you in written form. Below is an excerpt from the "Memorandum of Understanding" signed on April 6, 2025.

Together, we will:

- Subscribe to the constitution and bylaws of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and to the constitution and bylaws of the congregation.
- Worship, grow in faith, care for each other, reach out to the community around us, and seek to be God's people and followers of Jesus in this time and place
- Develop a process for working through 'sticking points', issues that in the past have led to significant conflict.
- Enter into careful and deep discussion about the role and responsibilities of the pastor.
- In conjunction with the above process, we will:
  - Develop a plan to discern how we, as a community of believers, can live and relate in ways that promote life.
  - After developing that plan, determine what if might look like to live that plan and commit to it.
- Commit to each other that we will intentionally work through differences that might lead to conflicts, with dual goals of resolving conflicts and learning better how to be a diverse and faithful community of followers of Jesus.
- Check in quarterly to review how we are working together and moving forward on our process.
- Invite others into this way of living together.

The "Being Different Together" workshops to be held in June, are our first step into developing a process to work through difficult issues. I hope you will participate. If you know anyone else who sometimes encounters challenges in relationships, please invite them as well!

We have entered the Easter season. No, Easter is not just one day of celebration. It is a fifty-day celebration—longer than the forty days of Lent. Easter has dawned! The light of Easter dawn is flowing into the darkness, overcoming it. We are an Easter people! In the coming weeks, we will again consider what that looks like in our world.

Alleluia, Christ is risen. Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!



The meeting was called to order at 10:16 a.m. by President M. Hart

Opening Prayer: Led by C. Monsen

Additions to Agenda: Under treasurer, questioning regarding investing in an Amazon Prime Account

Approval of agenda: Motion by B. Stobber, seconded by R. Knapton, to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried.

**Pastor's Report:** Did a visitation and in home communion. Did baptism of Emma Farmer on Feb. 23<sup>rd</sup>. Led worship on Sundays and Ash Wednesday. Finalized plans for Lenten worship. Wrote an article for the PeacePipe. Helped locate a baptism date for a young girl.
