The meeting was called to order at 10:09 a.m. by President M. Hart

Opening Prayer: Led by B. Stobber

Additions to Agenda: Christmas decorations under Worship

Approval of agenda: Motion by R. Knapton, seconded by J. Monsen to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report: Motion by J. Monsen seconded by C. Monsen to accept the council minutes as presented. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report (Sean McGinty) Deposits for the month of October were \$5109.00 Expenses were \$5631.75. The net balance for the month is a negative \$522.75. Motion by J. Monsen, seconded by R. Knapton, to accept the treasurer's report as presented. Motion carried.

S. McGinty presented the proposed 2025Congregational operational budget. The stewardship pledges, received to date, total \$76,380.00. After discussion, particularly regarding Pastor Carol's possible employment, a proposed budget was determined to be \$101.592.

Motion by B. Stobber to approve and recommend a 2025 congregational budget of \$101,600. Second by R. Knapton. Motion carried.

Nurturing the Faith – Worship (Elaine Sherry): A sign-up sheet for poinsettia purchase has been posted. New Christmas decorations will be purchased using monies from the Steve Sherry memorial fund.

Nurturing the Faith - Education (Chris Monsen): New children's books will be purchased to be rotated for use in the children's activity bags.

Growing Relationships (Renee Knapton): The sign-up sheet has been posted for the Anniversary Sunday pot-luck brunch. The Advent by Candlelight sign-up sheet has been posted.

Caring for the Community (Elsie Goulding): Information regarding the annual Love, Inc. "Turkey Drive". TLC "Christmas Gift Requests" have been posted. Items are due December 1st.

Inviting Folks In (Elsie Goulding): Have received confirmation of Peace's support for Santa's chalet.

Property Report – Open.: Worked on leaf collection and removal. Will be doing tractor and building winterization soon. Contacted Granite Ridge again for adjusted snow removal proposal.

Vice-President's Report (John Monsen): The MET has decided to temporarily pause their activities pending contract proposal with Pastor Carol.

President's Report (Marilyn Hart): Prepared agenda for council meeting. Kept council members informed through email regarding current issues. Communicated with Pastor Carol at Synod regarding the meeting on November 2nd and reaching out to Nicole Farmer regarding baptism. Responded to an email from Christina Rowntree regarding wedding. Will send further information when available.

New Business: Reviewed feedback from 'town' hall meeting with Pastors Carol and Kristen. Motion B. Stobber, seconded by S. McGinty to enter into contract with Pastor Carol Jeunnette to serve in a pastoral position at Peace. Motion carried.

The next meeting is scheduled for December 8, 2024.

Congregational Budget Meeting November 17, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by President Marilyn Hart.

Sixteen members were present, and a quorum was declared.

The purpose of the meeting was to ratify the 2025 congregational operational budget proposed and adopted by the church council at their November 10, 2024, meeting.

Sean McGinty, church council treasurer, reviewed the budget line by line. Major changes are an increased property insurance premium, and a provision to replace the outdoor storage shed.

Janet McGinty spoke regarding increasing the amount budgeted for the music staff. She related that in her year and a half search for a music director, she has found that the average salary is approximately \$23.00 to \$26.00 per hour. She recommended a proposed \$7500.00 budget allotment to cover all music staff needs. Motion by J. McGinty to make the \$7500.00 budget increase. Seconded by J. Monsen. Motion carried unanimously.

The total amened budget proposed is \$103,939.00. It was moved by J. McGinty and seconded by S. Ryd to approve the 2025 amended congregational budget. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by J. McGinty to adjourn. Seconded by C. Monsen. Motion Carried.

Meeting was adjourned at 10:25 a.m.
