I love Easter. I loved it as a kid. I didn't love Easter because we got new clothes. We were too poor for that. I didn't love Easter because I heard great choirs sing. The church of my childhood was too small for that. I loved Easter because that little congregation would always begin by singing "Low in the grave, he lay, Jesus my Savior." Then as we got to the refrain, the congregation would shout together: *Up from the grave he arose, with a mighty triumph o'er his foes, Hallelujah! Christ arose.*

Even as a kid it seemed clear to me that Christ was alive. When Satan had done his worst, God reared back and did his best—He raised his only Son from the dead. But here's the best news. PEACE LUTHERAN CHURCH Church Council Meeting February 11, 2024

Council Members Present: Elsie Goulding, , Renee Knapton, Janet McGinty, Chris Monsen, John Monsen, Pastor Quever, Elaine Sherry, Bev Stobber Excused, M. Hart

The meeting was called to order at 10:23 a.m. by Vice-President J. Monsen.

Opening Prayer: Led by J. Monsen

Additions to Agenda: None

Approval of Agenda: Motion by R. Knapton to approve agenda, seconded by C. Monsen

Pastor's Report: Has visited both Bill Goulding and Mary Lueder with communion. Has met with Kerry for some worship service changes and regarding Wednesday noon Lenten devotion services.

Secretary's Report (Bev Stobber) Minutes of the January 14th and February 4th council meetings along with the February Congregational meeting minutes were presented. Motion by J. McGinty, seconded by R. Knapton to accept the Feb. 4th congregational meeting minutes as presented. Motion carried. Motion by J. McGinty, seconded by C. Monsen to accept the January 14th council meeting minutes as corrected. Motion carried. Motion by J. McGinty, seconded by R. Knapton to accept the council minutes of Feb. 4th as presented. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report (Janet McGinty) Deposits for the month of December were \$15,203.00. Expenses were \$6,800.32, leaving a positive balance of \$8,402.68. Motion by C. Monsen, seconded by E. Goulding to accept the treasurer's report as presented. Motion carried.

W-2 and 1099 forms were sent out. The Synod congregation report was completed and filed. Pastor Quever's current PACT covenant lists salary of \$10,000.00/yr and housing of \$20,000.00/yr. He requests that the covenant be amended to Salary of \$6,000.00/yr. and housing of \$24,000.00/ yr. This request will be investigated. A request was received from the city and town of Burlington fire departments regarding a donation for a "fire safety education program" for primary grade students. Peace Lutheran's name would be listed in the program materials. **Motion by E. Sherry to use \$105.00 from the benevolence fund for this program. Second by C. Monsen. Motion carried.** The church's membership list was reviewed. Persons who have not communed or given a contribution of record during the previous two preceding years will be removed. Pastor Quever will place phone call where there is a question.

Nurturing the Faith – Worship (Elaine Sherry): Sign-up sheets for the Noon Lenten soup lunches have been posted.. The cost for Easter flowers will be investigated.

Nurturing the Faith – Education (Chris Monsen): Dan Knapton will continue the Homily Hash discussions after Sunday service during February. Janet McGinty will lead a program of Lenten Education in March.

Growing Relationships (Renee Knapton): The communities of Burlington, Rochester, and Waterford have been contacted as to where we might participate in a manner that would promote Peace Lutheran Church. Renee will place an article in the PeacePipe explaining "Salt Shaker Meals" or Gatherings. A sign-up sheet will be posted to determine interest.

Caring for the Community (Bev Stobber): The giving Baskets requests for March & April will be posted in the Peacepipe & Sunday bulletins.

Inviting Folks In - (Elsie Goulding): Tom and Carrie Fitzpatrick have expressed their desire for membership at Peace.

Property Report – Open: We Energies will be changing the church's gas meter on Feb. 12th Jim Hart is planning on removing the box elder tree on the south side of the parking lot near the shed.

Vice-President's Report (John Monsen) No report.

President's Report (Marilyn Hart): Sent monthly list of tasks agreed upon at last council meeting. Worked with all to have a very successful workshop on Jan. 20th. Still gathering info from workshop to share with Pastor Carol. Contacted church secretary about a few changes for weekly bulletins. Reported that Kerry will be available to play live for the Ash Wednesday service and for the Wed. afternoon services during Lent.

Unfinished Business: The transfer request of Pastor Susan and Tom Bowen was successfully completed.

Janet reported that 24 families pledged to give \$38,425.00 to replace the parking lot. A deposit of \$15,00.00 was paid in April 2022 and the balance of \$48,426.00 was paid in July 2022.

The next meeting is scheduled for March 10, 2024
