

Meet Our Farmers: Michael Nnko & Elituliza Ndelekwa



Michael Nnko is an highly capable and energetic farmer despite having lost a leg in a motorcycle accident five years ago. His farm is 3.5 acres with 2,600 trees including 1,900 of the newer disease-resistant variety available through the farmers' cooperative.

With the Project for 3 years, he joined for the training and the higher prices for the coffee cherries. Michael used to sell to others outside the Project, but reported that he didn't always receive the money. Now he trusts that he will receive the payout! He has innovated with new methods to increase production, including planting new trees among the old to ease immature producers into the farm while maximizing land utilization. He appreciated that the training taught him about disease-resistant varieties and how to avoid using chemicals. He and his wife, Elituliza Ndelekwa, have 5 children. Elituliza also coffee farms on a 3/4 acre plot she purchased in 2020 with proceeds from her and Michael's coffee the prior year. She planted 340 new trees which are now beginning to produce. She has attended training also, and really appreciates that the Project teaches farmers how to grow more coffee. Her income benefits her children.



The meeting was called to order at 10:03 am by B. Stobber.

Approval of Agenda: Motion by J. McGinty to approve agenda as printed, seconded by J. Smith. Pastor's Report:

- · Conducted Ginger Goetsch's funeral.
- Visited with Mary Lueder.
- There has been good attendance at mid-week Lenten services.
- She continues to train Carol. Janet will post her picture on announcements.
- Color was chosen for new conference room.
- Sunday fill-ins needed: April 16, May 21, June 4, possibly April 30 (will get pulpit supply).
- She has been working much more than 20-25 hours per week the past 8 months. This summer she will take some comp time.

Secretary (Sharon Ryd):

• Thanks to Elaine for filling in as Secretary in February and preparing the minutes. **Motion by J. Hart to accept**February 12, 2023 minutes as presented, seconded by J. McGinty.

Treasurer's Report (Janet McGinty):

- Received a gift to help pay for tree removal & clean-up.
- \$800 sent to Lutheran World Relief for Turkey earthquake (\$750 from congregation, \$50 from church)
- Snowplow costs are \$1500.
- Finished \$1643 short. Last month over \$8346.
- Added \$1570 for Jerry Koch memorial, which is for front stoop.
- New memorial fund set up for Virginia Goetsch.
- Will look into transferring some money to some kind of savings fund to earn interest, leaving about \$10,000 in checking. Janet and Jim Hart will talk to Associated Bank.
