God's Unlikely Heroes!

Today the Church celebrates two great saints, God's unlikely heroes, Saints Peter and Paul. Each in their own different ways carried on the mission and ministry of Jesus as they proclaimed the gospel through their life as missionary disciples in the early Church.

From the scriptures we learn that St. Peter knew Jesus. He was one of Jesus' disciples and a close friend. He heard Jesus speak and teach. He saw Jesus work miracles. Peter was at the last supper with Jesus and the other disciples. He was witness to all that happened to Jesus. Peter three times denied that he knew Jesus when Jesus was arrested, before crucifixion and death.

Peter lost faith in Jesus, but Jesus did not loose his faith in Peter.

After resurrection, when Jesus appeared to his disciples, he asked Peter three times whether he loved him. When Peter answered that he loved him, Jesus said to Peter, "Look after my sheep... feed my sheep..." Peter is given the responsibility to lead the Church, the people of God. On the other Paul never met Jesus. He did experience Jesus in a most profound way. Paul a Jew of high standing, was entrusted with the responsibility to hunt down the Christians, who were seen as a threat to the Jewish faith and Law. On the road to Damascus, he experienced what changed his

life. He heard Jesus' words, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" By persecuting the Christians, Saul was persecuting Jesus. Saul becomes Paul, the greatest missionary of the early Church. Despite their weaknesses God chose both Peter and Paul to proclaim the gospel to all nations. These are models of what it means to be a follower of Jesus today. Jesus called Peter who denied him and Paul who persecuted him to be his witnesses. God does not look at outer appearance, but at the heart of a person. Like Peter and Paul, Jesus is calling us to be his witnesses here and now in our own environment and situation.
