## **Christ Our hope is Risen!**

Easter Sunday is the greatest feast of our liturgical year. May our readings fill us with hope and deep joy, whatever our circumstances may be. Easter Sunday naturally offers us the stories of Jesus' resurrection and the implications thereof. The gospel passages explain the events of women discovering the empty tomb and then sharing the good news of Jesus' resurrection. The first and second readings reveal the meaning of Jesus' resurrection for the followers of Jesus. The first reading, from the Acts, shows how Peter has grown in his faith. He is spreading the Good News and gives his person witness to the resurrection of Jesus to the Gentiles as well as Jews. The psalm is a joyful song of the Lord who has triumphed over suffering and death. The second challenges us to live out the reality and the consequences of the resurrection for us. We have been brought back to true life with Christ. In our Gospel we see Mary Magdalene, running to tell the disciples about the empty tomb. Peter and the beloved disciple discover this for themselves and slowly come to believe that Jesus is risen. The disciples did not understand the teaching of the Scriptures. What would Peter think and feel as he stood in the empty tomb? And other disciples? What is our experience of the empty tomb? What is the resurrection of Jesus in my life here and now? As Pilgrims of Hope, this Jubilee year encourages us to acknowledge that we need to pause, to give time rest and worship. May the Easter season lead us to put aside some time for quiet reflection each day or maybe enable someone else to do so. What is the significance of the resurrection of Jesus to me?
