Easter Sunday

First reading - Acts 10:34,37-43 - 'We have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection'

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 117(118):1-2,16-17,22-23 - *This day was made by the Lord: we rejoice and are glad.*

Second reading - Colossians 3:1-4 - Look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is

Gospel Acclamation - 1Cor5:7-8 - Alleluia, alleluia! Christ, our passover, has been sacrificed: let us celebrate the feast then, in the Lord. Alleluia!

Gospel - John 20:1-9 - He must rise from the dead

He is risen indeed!

As we come to the end of our Lenten journey and celebrate the Passover and the Risen Lord, we reflect on our salvation through Christ. The story of the life of Jesus, the Son of God, does not end with his passion and death; if it did then Jesus would have been simply another good person, a prophet perhaps, but nothing more. As St. Paul reflects with the Philippians (2:6-11), God raised Jesus to new life, glorifying him and God at the same time. Thus, Jesus becomes the Christ, the Anointed One, the instrument of our salvation.

Easter Sunday brings to a glorious conclusion the season of Lent, Holy Week and the Easter Triduum. Christ has indeed risen, as can be witnessed by the empty tomb and the experience of the apostles who ate and drank with him after the resurrection. In the gospel reading, John insists that the empty tomb is not a hallucination. He carefully observes the setting, noting the linen cloths that had held the lifeless body of Jesus, were on the ground, they were no longer necessary. Moreover, the cloth that covered Jesus' face was neatly rolled up and placed in a separate place. This was not a hurried job, the body of Jesus had certainly not been stolen. This is the work of God.

St. Paul reminds us that through our baptism, we too already share in the new life of Jesus because we have been baptized in Christ. To be baptized is to be totally immersed. We have been totally immersed into Christ's death and resurrection and given a new life in him. We have now to wait for that time when we too will enjoy the same glory into which Jesus has gained new life.
