First reading - Acts 4:32-35 - The whole group of believers was united, heart and soul

DIVINE MERCY

The second Sunday of Easter is known as Divine Mercy Sunday. If there was ever a person to be in need of divine mercy, it must be Thomas in today's gospel. History has not been kind to Thomas, by labeling him as "doubting Thomas". If anything, all he was asking for was the same experience that the other apostles received in seeing Jesus when he appeared to them. One thing that surprises us all, is about the where about of Thomas when Jesus fist appeared to the Apostles. Where on earth did, he go? When all others were in a locked room out of fear? But one thing is for sure, all the Apostles receive all Jesus had to give from his pierced heart: the gift of divine mercy that we celebrate today.

This Sunday we are all called to reflect on how divine mercy sums up the whole mystery of Christ's passion, death and resurrection. Notice how Jesus immediately greets the Apostles with peace and shares his bountiful mercy. He does not chastise them for running away from him, denying him, and or misunderstanding him. It is the deepest truth God has shared about himself: He Is mercy, he loves us even when we do not deserve it.

God's mercy does not only cleanse us from our past. It gives us a way forward. When in the gospel today Jesus breathed on the Apostles and said to them "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" the church has long understood this as the scriptural foundation for the development of the sacrament of reconciliation.

However, the power to forgive or not, also resides with us individually. When we allow and accept divine mercy into our hearts, it manifests in our works of mercy for others. Jesus pours out his mercy on us so that we can our out his mercy on others. If our praying of the Divine Mercy chaplet and other devotions of Divine Mercy has no effect on our own willingness to extend mercy to those who hurt, disappoint or offend us, then one really has not accepted God's divine mercy in their heart, as you can only give what you have received. The peace and mercy Jesus gives to the Apostles comes with a command to go and share it: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you". These men who had been hiding in a locked room then became such powerful witnesses to the Resurrection that they established a community unequaled in solidarity and generosity in all of human history.

May the Divine Mercy of be on us all. Fr. Henry


