Third Sunday of Easter

First reading - Acts 3:13-15,17-19 - You killed the prince of life: God, however, raised him from the dead

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 4:2,4,7,9 - Lift up the light of your face on us, O Lord.

Second reading - 1 John 2:1-5 - Jesus Christ is the sacrifice that takes our sins away, and the world's

Gospel Acclamation - cf.Lk24:32 - Alleluia, alleluia! Lord Jesus, explain the Scriptures to us. Make our hearts burn within us as you talk to us. Alleluia!

Gospel - Luke $24{:}35{\cdot}48$ - It is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead

Peace be with you

On this third Sunday of Easter, we continue to hear gospel accounts of Jesus' appearances to his disciples following his resurrection. Today's gospel passage from the gospel of Luke, follows immediately after report of Jesus' appearance to his disciples on the road to Emmaus. This is the event being recounted by the disciples in the opening verse of today's gospel.

Consistently in the reports of Jesus' post-resurrection appearance, Jesus greets his disciples with encouraging words: "Peace be with you." This is a most appropriate greeting, at the moment the disciples have just witnessed the death of their beloved master, and they now fear for their own lives. Peace is what they need most at this time. Jesus often connects this greeting of peace with the gift of forgiveness. In the gospel today, this connection is made in the final verses.

Even as they hear Jesus' greeting of peace, the disciples are terrified. They are not sure about what they are seeing, quite understandably, they mistake Jesus for a ghost. Jesus invites them to experience his resurrected body with their senses, to look and to touch. The figure before them is human, flesh and bone, still bearing the marks of crucifixion. Although the disciple cannot forget Jesus' suffering and death, peace begins to take root in them, as their fears turn to joy and amazement.

As a further proof of his identity and of his resurrected body, Jesus eats with his disciples. The disciples have known Jesus best through the meals he had shared with them. Descriptions of these meals are a defining element of Luke's Gospel. By eating with his disciples after his resurrection, Jesus recalls all the meals, and most important, he recalls the Last Supper.

Luke's report of the last supper and the meals that Jesus shared with his disciples after his resurrection unveil for us the importance of the Eucharist. Having shared a meal with his disciples, Jesus now uncovers for them the significance of what was written in the scriptures about him. So too, our celebration of Mass is an encounter with Jesus, through the Word and Sacrament of the Eucharist. As Jesus commissions his disciples to be witnesses to what scriptures foretold, our celebration of the Eucharist commissions us. Like the disciples, we are sent to announce the Good News of Jesus' forgiveness of sins.
