### **The Most Holy Trinity**

**First reading** - Deuteronomy 4:32-34,39-40 - **The Lord is God indeed: he and no other**

**Responsorial Psalm** - Psalm 32(33):4-6,9,18-20,22 - ***Happy the people the Lord has chosen as his own.***

**Second reading** - Romans 8:14-17 - **The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God**

**Gospel Acclamation** - cf. Rv1:8 - **Alleluia, alleluia! Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; the God who is, who was, and who is to come. Alleluia!**

**Gospel** - Matthew 28:16-20 - **Go and make disciples of all nations**

### **Trinity, One God in Three Persons**

As we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time, as always on this first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. And next Sunday we are going to celebrate another Solemnity of Corpus Christi. These are two special days that call our attention to the central mysteries of our faith. The feast of the Most Holy Trinity invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity, one God in three persons. In whose name we were all welcomed at our baptism.

In our first reading today, Moses reminds the people of everything God has done for them in freeing them from slavery in Egypt. All they are asked in return for the prosperity and eternal life that God offers is that they should obey God's commandments. In a similar situation, the Psalmist encouraged the people to rejoice in the gifts God gives to all his chosen people. We are reminded particularly of the gifts of creation, protection from want and evil, and God's faithful love.

St. Paul in the second reading, speaks about the Spirit which makes us all children of God. Through this gift of the Spirit, we like Jesus, can call God, our Father and share in his glory.

In the gospel we see the risen sending the disciples into the world to make disciples. Jesus commissions the disciples their mission of baptizing people throughout the world in the name of the Trinity. He reminds them that he remains with them always. The mission of Jesus is now to be taken to all people, and the task is to baptize and to teach.

As we read this gospel passage on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we are reminded that this central mystery of our faith is meant to be lived. As baptized Christians, we share in the life of the blessed Trinity and seek to invite others to share in God's love.

**May The Holy Trinity keep us united. Fr. Henry.**

On Saturday June 29th at 8pm, a one-off event will take place in Brentwood Cathedral... a Battle of the Organs. The mighty Cathedral instrument, originally built by Hunter, and rebuilt in 1990 by Daniel of Clevedon, will go head-to-head with a new Allen GX350. Allen Organs UK are very kindly lending us the instrument not only for the Battle, but also for the following morning to allow the Cathedral Choir to sing one of the great French double organ Masses at the 11.30am Mass.

In charge of these instruments on the night will be Donald MacKenzie (Organist of the Odeon, Leicester Square) and James Davy (formerly Master of Music of Chelmsford Cathedral and currently Organist at the Royal Hospital School, Holbrook). We can promise you highly entertaining evening as these two amazing organists put these organs through their paces, and 'pull out all the stops' to give us a concert to remember.
