The Holy Spirit will Teach you all things.

John in chapter 14 where our gospel reading is from, continues to recount Jesus' farewell discourse after the Last Supper. In today's gospel passage Jesus speaks about the indwelling of the Father and son in the human soul, and the role of the Holy Spirit in the life of Jesus' disciples. Four important points are worthy of our reflections

- 1. The abiding presence of God in the human soul. In today's gospel reading, Jesus tells us that the one thing in life which we can always trust is God's presence. God inhabits our hearts so deeply and intimately that we become the visible dwelling place of God. God's living and life-affirming presence is always with us, yet "hidden" in the little things we so often take for granted. Thus, we are challenged to look for and encounter God with us, in the person near us, in the words we speak and, in the songs, we sing at worship.
- 2. The conditions for the indwelling of the Holy Trinity: Jesus teaches us the condition for this indwelling of the Holy Trinity, namely, we must show our love of God by keeping his word. And this keeping of his word will be facilitated by the Holy Spirit, The Advocate that the Father will send.
- 3. The role of the Holy Spirit: The twofold work of the Holy Spirit is to 'teach' and to 'remind his disciples of what Jesus has already taught them. Jesus affirms that even though he will no longer be visibly with them, he will continue to be present among them through the Holy Spirit. The Spirit of truth will continue teaching them and helping them to understand and to build on what Jesus has already taught them.
 - 4. Jesus gives his disciples four gifts: He gives them his love. This will enable them to keep his word. Then he gives them the Holy Spirit, who will teach them everything they need to know. The third gift is the gift of peace to strengthen them against fear in the face of trouble. When God's love lives in us, and we live in Him, there is much more peace in our hearts. The last gift is Jesus' assurance of his second coming. He will go to the father to prepare for his disciples.

We like the disciples we have received these gifts. Let us be aware of the abiding presence of God within us. We are not alone. We need only to allow Jesus into our lives. It is the abiding presence of God within us that will enable us to face the future with hope and true Christian courage.
