Christ the King - Solemnity

First reading - Daniel 7:13-14 - I saw, coming on the clouds of heaven, one like a son of man Responsorial Psalm - 92(93):1-2,5 - *The Lord is king, with majesty enrobed.*

Second reading - Apocalypse 1:5-8 - Jesus Christ has made us a line of kings and priests

Gospel Acclamation - Mk11:10 - Alleluia, alleluia! Blessings on him who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessings on the coming kingdom of our father David! Alleluia!

Gospel - John 18:33-37 - Yes, I am a king

I Am a King...

The solemnity of Christ the King marks the end of the church's ordinary time, and the entire liturgical calendar of year B. Today we celebrate the kingship of Christ, the King of kings, the Lord of lords, the beginning and the end.

Both our first and second readings bear witness to the Kingship of Christ. Daniel prophesied about Christ's eternal and peaceful reign. He identified him as the "Son of Man." John in the second reading called him: "the firstborn of all creation...The Alpha and the Omega." Both readings also remind us that Christ's reign shall be that of peace, justice, love and truth.

In today's gospel passage, Pilate and Jews ignorantly crucified Christ their king. They did not accept the truth that Christ preached about God's kingdom. They hardened their hearts, thinking that everything ends here on earth. Like Pilate and his people, sometimes we are deceived by what we see in this world. By believing that everything ends here on earth. The truth is that the kingdom of this world will pass away, but the kingdom of God will last forever.

One of today's celebration's most important goals is to acknowledge and worship Christ as the King of the Universe. We must allow Christ to reign in our lives. Today's celebration challenges us to ask ourselves this fundamental question: Is Christ reigning in my life? Today's feast will be meaningless if we do not allow Christ to reign in our lives, in our families and in the world. The feast today calls us to take Christ for our role model. He should be a model to all kings, rulers and leaders.
