Peace be to this house.

Today on the fourteenth Sunday in ordinary time, our gospel reading is about peace. The peace that comes from God. Jesus sends seventy-two disciples on a mission to proclaim two important elements of Jesus' message: Peace and the coming of the Kingdom of God. The 72 are sent in pairs. In the law of Moses two witnesses were needed for a testimony to be credible. It was probably also a safer way to travel Jesus knows that he is sending them out like lambs among wolves. He orders them to carry nothing and to greet no one on the way, so as not to be preoccupied, and distracted from their mission. Wherever they go when they enter a house, their message is "peace to this house." The response they will receive may be positive or negative. Either way, the disciples must let the household know that the kingdom of God is near at hand. Jesus also warned the disciples not to demand special treatment, but to be happy with what is provided for them; 'for the labourer deserves his wages.' They are to heal the sick as a sign that the Kingdom of God is near at hand for them. If the town does not receive them, they are to shake the dust from their feet and move on. Even in such situation, they disciples should announce the coming of the Kingdom of God.

The seventy-two returned rejoicing, as their mission was successful. Demons were under their power because of the name of Jesus. The 72 were sent like lambs among wolves, but Jesus assured them that they were given authority over the enemy and nothing will harm them. That is how God cares for his own. Today's gospel message for us is about discipleship, its challenges its difficulties, and its rewards. Sharing in the mission of Jesus is difficult, but we are called to do it. We are called to be missionaries, to proclaim the coming of the Kingdom of God. "The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few."
