# All entries must meet requirements of the 4-H and FFA programs. 4-H members showing livestock must be 8 years old by the beginning of the 4-H year (January 1, 2025).

All exhibits must be the property and project of the exhibitor.

Each exhibitor is limited to one exhibit per lot. Each exhibitor may sell only one market animal per species. Each animal may only be exhibited in one lot.

Pre-registration forms are due by August 1, 2025, and sent to lemmon.junior@yahoo.com

If an exhibitor is unable to show their animal the date of the Lemmon Junior Livestock Show, a written request must be submitted prior to show day to the Board of Directors, and received no later than September 1, 2025. The animal will be allowed to be judged in a pen and only eligible for a blue, red or white ribbon placing. The animal will also be allowed to be sold in the premium sale.

All cattle exhibits must be trained to tie and lead. Unmanageable livestock can be disqualified.

4-H livestock, of the same lot, must be shown at the County Achievement Days before showing in Lemmon.

All livestock exhibitors must wear boots or closed toed shoes.

All market livestock will be weighed as they **are** entered and such weight will be the selling weight at the sale that evening.

In order that each entrant be treated the same, no coaching will be permitted within the judging area. No one except exhibitor, judges and stock show personnel shall be in the judging area or auctioneer's stand during judging of livestock. Coaching and cueing by others after the animals enter the show ring will disqualified the exhibitor.

Hay, bedding, grain, feed boxes and water buckets will be furnished by the exhibitor. Water facilities will be furnished by the show.

All exhibitors must clean pen area prior to leaving.

All entries to be shown are to be in by 8:00 a.m. on show day and will be released at 5:00 p.m. All livestock entries must be removed by noon the following day. Lemmon Junior is not responsible for livestock.

Any premiums not collected by April 1, 2026 will be forfeited.

The decision of the judges will be final.

The show will not be responsible for any accident occurring to exhibitors or exhibits.

The Board of Directors reserves the right to amend any or all rules the day of the show and sale.

# IMPORTANT NOTICE!! HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Due to animal health laws in both North and South Dakota, certain tests are required on some livestock before they can be shown at the Lemmon Junior Livestock Show. The tests that must be done are as follows:

#### **CATTLE**

All cattle must be free of warts and ringworm.

#### **HOGS**

Hogs do not need to be bled. No test required.

#### SHEEP

All sheep <u>must</u> have official **USDA premises or origin tags** in the ear regardless of age, sex, or breed.

Rams six months of age and older must be tested negative for Ram Epididimitis (Brucella Ovis) within 30 days or come from a current Brucella Ovis free flock. Bring test results to the Lemmon Junior Livestock Show.

#### **GOAT**

All goats <u>must</u> have official **USDA premises of origin tags** in the ear regardless of age, sex, or breed.

Market goats are to have horns blunted before arrival. Preferred to be dehorned.

Goats must be free of external parasites, ringworm, warts and abscesses. All animals entered at the exhibition shall be "Free from evidence of all contagious diseases such as ringworm, pinkeye, lump jaw, abscesses, and warts." If warts have been removed surgically the scars must be healed by the time of exhibition.

#### REMEMBER:

These tests are required by the State Livestock Sanitary Boards of both North and South Dakota - not the Lemmon Junior Livestock Show committee. If you have any questions, contact your local veterinarian .

If the above requirements are not met, animals will not be allowed to be shown!

# PLEASE NOTE AUCTION SALE PROCEDURE

The Lemmon Junior Livestock Show has traditionally marked the end of the show season, and with that participants have sold their market animals at the Lemmon Junior's auction sale. Our sale procedure will be to have each participant who has a market animal, to enter the sale ring, and bidders will have the opportunity to bid on a premium for the project, not on the animal.

Participants that do not have a market animal in the show, will be eligible to sell any one breeding class animal in the premium sale. Exhibitors must determine which animal they will sell the premium sale when they register.

The 4-H or FFA member will still own their market animal, and must make their own decision on how to market their animal. Each participant will have the option of selling their market animal that evening or taking it home for their own marketing or personal use. Since most market animals are finished and ready to be sold by the time of the Lemmon show, the Lemmon Junior Livestock Show board has made arrangements with Lemmon Livestock to also offer the livestock for sale after the premium is sold. The 4-H or FFA member will receive a final bid price.





#### LIVESTOCK SHOWMANSHIP

The purpose of showing an animal is to show it to its best advantage. In some cases, an animal of good quality does not place as high as it might in the show ring because the club member does not show it as they should.

It is not too difficult to show an animal so that it will look its best in front of a judge. However it does take some patience and effort.

The animal must be worked with and trained before show time rolls around. The hooves must be trimmed so the animal can stand correctly. For beef and dairy animals, either a rope halter or a leather show halter may be used when showing the animal. A leather halter adds to the appearance of the animal.

When showing beef, goats and sheep, always keep them in a straight line when lined up side-by-side. When the animals are in a circle, they are head to tail and there should always be a little space left between each of the animals.

Keep an eye on your animal and be aware of the position of the judge at all times. Do not be distracted by persons and things outside the ring. Show the animal at all times and not yourself. Respond rapidly to requests from the judges and officials. Be courteous and sportsmanlike at all times. The exhibitor should attempt to stay cool, calm and collected at all times and try not to make fast jerky movements. Keep showing until the entire class has been placed and the judge has given their reasons.

The exhibitor should always know where the judge is, in other words, "keep one eye on the judge."

Always show the animal from the left side or the front but never from the right side.

Avoid bumping, crowding or striking another exhibitors animal. When the animals are lined up, they should be standing straight in the line and not too far ahead or too far back. Avoid crowding into a lineup if there are other openings available.

A member may win overall showmanship in each age division for only one year.


Coaching and cueing by others after the animals enter the show ring will disqualify the exhibitor.
