## COURSE DESCRIPTION

LSI ENGLISH FOR FUTURE LEADERS (JUNIOR COURSE)

Elevate your child's potential and inspire their journey as a future leader with a 4-week **LSI Future Leaders Junior Course**. This dynamic program is designed to foster essential life skills, creativity, and leadership qualities, empowering young minds for success.

During this course, students explore diverse aspects of leadership through a variety of hands-on activities and interactive challenges. From creating imaginative product adverts to solving thrilling murder mysteries, they'll develop teamwork, critical thinking, and communication abilities. This engaging course ensures every child experiences leadership by taking on different roles in various activities, enhancing their overall leadership potential.

This programme runs at **LSI London Central, LSI Cambridge, every Monday starting from July 1 - August 5, ends August 9, students depart Aug 10** Students have the option to study for fewer weeks and join specific modules on the given dates.

The **English for Future Leaders Course** consists of **20 lessons a week**. Each lesson is 50 minutes.

**Minimum English level: Intermediate (B1)**

**Includes:** Course 1-4 weeks / 20 lessons a week / classes with a maximum of 17 students.

MODULES	DESCRIPTION
<p><b>MODULE 1:</b> <b>Bringing Dreams to Life: Business, Marketing and Advertising.</b></p>	<p><b>Topic focus:</b> Would-Be Entrepreneurs, thinking about and discussing what bringing dreams to life means and how young people can be inspired to do great things in the world of work.</p> <p><b>Skills focus:</b> Identifying the main points of a text and using abbreviations while note-taking.</p> <p><b>Assignment:</b> Producing and filming an advert for an imaginary product. Students work in groups to come up with a brand name and a slogan for their product then they write the script for an advert and film it on a phone. Students watch the adverts together and vote for whichever team they think produced the most convincing one. During this activity there will be a role for an overall leader, a camera person, script writers and actors.</p>

<p><b>MODULE 2:</b> <b>Art and Conservation: Treasured Places.</b></p>	<p><b>Topic focus:</b> Preservation of our planet’s natural beauty and how nature can inspire works of art.  <b>Skills focus:</b> Interpreting and synthesizing information from different sources. Using linking words and ‘sign-posting language’. Ways of organizing a good presentation.  <b>Assignment:</b> How to save the planet. Students read articles on methods reduce ecological problems such as pollution and global warming, such as banning private cars from city centres, fining citizens who don’t recycle rubbish, reducing the population by taxing families that have more than one child or making the use of non-electric, petrol-run vehicles illegal. Then, students imagine that they are government officials and choose which of the methods would be the most effective. Next, they work in groups to produce a presentation that attempts to convince their classmates that the method they have chosen is the most effective and efficient.</p>
<p><b>MODULE 3:</b> <b>Linguistics and Communication: Say It Your Way.</b></p>	<p><b>Topic focus:</b> Thinking about and discussing what expressing yourself means, being a good listener and practicing critical thinking skills.  <b>Skills focus:</b> Understanding and producing definitions of words and terms. Language of deduction and probability.  <b>Assignment A:</b> Sherlock Holmes Murder Mystery. In groups, students are given the details of a murder. They then uncover clues that will lead them to the murder weapon, the murderer, and the motive. The first group guess all three correctly wins.  <b>Assignment B:</b> Local Treasure Hunt: Students work in teams to see who will be the first to complete all the treasure-hunt tasks and win a delicious prize. Team leaders need to produce a plan of action to ensure that their team tackles their tasks in the quickest and most efficient ways possible.  <i><b>A different student takes the leadership role in each different activity, so each individual gets a chance to experience that role.</b></i></p>
