Case Study – Bylaw Consultation & Review Overview



Due to the growing number of Short-term Accommodations (STAs) in the community, the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula had been attempting to implement a bylaw to regulate them but was struggling to gain community consensus.

Canvas designed and ran a public consultation process to build greater trust between owners, community members, and the Municipality. The results of the extensive consultations were synthesized into a series of clear recommendations for a revised bylaw that is currently being finalized.


