



London (5 nights) | **Brussels** (3 nights) | **Amsterdam** (4 nights)

Tuesday, June 10: Program Begins in London, England: Welcome Drink and Dinner.

Participants should plan to arrive at London Heathrow Airport (LHR) by 1:00 PM. Private drivers will meet participants and take them to our London hotel, centrally located near the iconic **Tower Bridge**. In the early evening, the group will gather for a **Welcome Drink** followed by a **Welcome Dinner** at a contemporary English pub restaurant.

Wednesday, June 11: Symposium at the Gordon Museum of Pathology with Private Lectures and Visit of the Old Operating Theatre Museum.

In the morning, we'll attend a private symposium at the **Gordon Museum of Pathology** at **King's College**, where short lectures will be given by the curator, **Dr. Bill Edwards**, and ceroplastic art historian, **Dr. Roberta Ballestriero**. They will discuss the museum's anatomical, pathological and dermatological collections for medical teaching and describe differences between the European and Italian schools of anatomical wax modeling. A Q&A opportunity will be held during a walk and talk visit through the museum. Afterward, enjoy some leisure time and lunch on your own at the nearby, trendy **Borough Market**.

In the afternoon, we'll visit the **Old Operating Theatre Museum and Herb Garret**, which is housed in the attic of the early 18th century church of the **Old St Thomas' Hospital**. As the oldest surviving surgical theatre in Europe, it offers a unique insight into the history of medicine and surgery. There will be a presentation on the history of St Thomas' Hospital and surgery during the Victorian times, followed by a lecture on the history of surgery in London by award winning author, **Dr. Lindsey Fitzharris**!

Thursday, June 12: Guided Walking Tour of Medieval London, Priory Church of St. Bartholomew the Great, The Society Apothecaries of London and the Wellcome Library.

We'll start the day with a private guided walking tour from our hotel, crossing the pedestrian **Millenium Bridge** to reach the oldest part of London, and passing by the beautiful **Saint Paul's Cathedral**. After a short underground tube ride, we'll reach the **Priory Church of St. Bartholomew the Great**, London's oldest parish church (founded in the year 1123). Here we can admire the spectacular statue of St. Bartholomew, **Exquisite Pain**, by Damien Hirst. Our walk will continue through the medieval streets of Blackfriars where we will visit the **Society Apothecaries of London**, dating back to 1617. This Society was instrumental in raising the status of apothecaries as general practitioners.

After a lunch break in this charming historical district, we'll reach the **Wellcome Library**, a collection of rare books in the history of science and medicine. A curator will present series of original texts, such as *The Fabrica* by Vesalius, and *de Moto Cordis* by Harvey!

Friday, June 13: Royal London Sightseeing and Visit to the Hunterian Museum.

From our hotel, we'll enjoy a short scenic ride by river boat to reach some of the most iconic monuments of London: **Big Ben**, **Westminster Abbey** and **Buckingham Palace**. As we walk by these sites, our local guide will provide insights into Royal History and traditions. Our tour will end in the famous district of **Covent Garden**, where you'll have free time to enjoy the local shops and lunch on our own.

In the afternoon, we'll walk to the **Hunterian Museum**, named after the 18th century surgeon and anatomist John Hunter (1728-1793). The museum includes over 2,000 anatomical preparations from Hunter's original collection, alongside instruments, equipment, models, paintings and archive material, tracing the history of surgery from ancient times to the latest robot-assisted operations.



Saturday, June 14: Guided Walking Tour of the Tower of London. The Science Museum.

In the morning, we'll enjoy a short, guided tour, first walking over the majestic **Tower Bridge**, a bridge that has spanned the River Thames between the City of London and Southwark since Roman times. From here, we'll reach the **Tower of London**, officially His Majesty's Royal Palace, and one of England's most evocative ancient monuments. This castle, which began being built in 1067, has several buildings set within two concentric rings of defensive walls and a moat. Inside, we'll have a tour of the many historic rooms and exhibitions, where we can also admire the **Crown Jewels**.

In the afternoon, join Dr. Petti for a visit to **The Wellcome Galleries at the Science Museum**, which hosts some of the most significant medical collections in the world, featuring objects such as the lancet used for the first smallpox vaccinations by Edward Jenner himself, to the original Watson and Crick Nobel Prize earning DNA model!

Sunday, June 15: Departure to Brussels. Guided Walking Tour. Welcome to Brussels Dinner.

In the morning, after checking out of our hotel, we'll travel via Eurostar train to the beautiful city of **Brussels, Belgium** (approximately a 2-hour ride). After arrival, we'll check-in to our hotel, located in the heart of historic Brussels. In the afternoon, we'll enjoy a short, guided walking tour through the historic center to familiarize everyone with the area. In the evening, we'll enjoy a **Welcome Dinner** at a traditional Brussels restaurant.

Monday, June 16: Museum of Anatomy and Embryology and Le Musée de la Médecine. Guided Tour with Chocolate-Tasting.

In the morning, we'll reach the campus of **ULB** (*Université libre de Bruxelles - Free University of Brussels*) to visit the **Museum of Anatomy and Embryology**, founded in 1838 by Professor Louis Deroubaix. The museum includes numerous anatomical and embryological specimens made of wax and plaster alongside modern "plastinated" and freshly-dissected specimens. After a short break, we'll continue our morning with a guided visit to the nearby **Le Musée de la Médecine**. This museum attempts to bridge the gap between medicine and art. It presents a heritage constituted of archaeological objects, works of art, as well as ancient medical tools and instruments that illustrate the long evolution of the art of healing through time.

In the afternoon, we'll have a guided tour in the heart of Brussels discovering 1000 years of history and walk by the major sites such as the **Grand Place**, the lively Saint Géry area, the old Stock Exchange, the Cathedral of Saints Michael and Gudula, *Manneken Pis*, and the Royal Galleries Saint Hubert. During our tour, we'll of course enjoy some sample tasting of the world-famous Brussels chocolate!

Tuesday, June 17: Visit to KU Leuven University and Guided Walking Tour.

In the morning, we'll take a local train to the quaint city of **Leuven**, known for its medieval Gothic architecture and **KU Leuven** (*Katholieke Universiteit Leuven – Catholic University of Leuven*), which was founded in 1425. We'll visit the University to see the recently acquired and very special second edition of *The Fabrica* by Vesalius, which includes the author's handwritten notes for a never-realized third edition!

After free time for lunch, we'll enjoy a guided walking tour of the historic city center to pass by some of the noteworthy sites from the time of Vesalius, while also passing landmarks such as the Town Hall built in the 15th century, and the Saint Peter's Church (itself designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1999). Afterward, we'll return to Brussels where you can enjoy the remainder of the day and evening at your leisure.



PROGRAM ITINERARY AND REGISTRATION

Wednesday, June 18: Departure to Amsterdam. Waag's Theatrum Anatomicum. Dinner.

In the morning, after checking out of our hotel, we'll travel by high-speed train (approximately a 2-hour ride) to the city of **Amsterdam**, the capital of the Netherlands, known for its artistic heritage and elaborate canal system. We'll arrive in the early afternoon and check-in to our historic hotel located in the heart of Amsterdam, near **Dam Square** and the **Singel Canal**. Enjoy some time at your leisure.

In the late afternoon, we'll enjoy a private visit to **The Waag's Theatrum Anatomicum** with a special presentation by a historian guide. Built in 1691, this space served as home to Amsterdam's Surgeon's Guild. Here is where the annual public dissections occurred, and the location memorialized in Rembrandt's *Anatomy Lesson of Dr. Tulp*. Following our visit, we'll have dinner at a special restaurant located in the same building, illuminated by candles.

Thursday, June 19: Amsterdam Sightseeing, Hermitage Museum, and Vrolik Museum.

In the morning, we'll discover Amsterdam by foot with our private tour guide, including stops at the historic **Begijnhof** almshouse, the historical Jewish neighborhood, and the house where Rembrandt once lived. The tour continues to the **Hermitage Museum** (now called the **H'ART Museum**), which hosts some of the most important anatomy-related paintings from the 17th century, including **Rembrandt's** *The Anatomy Lesson of Dr. Deijman*.

In the afternoon, we'll visit the **Vrolik Museum** at the University of Amsterdam School of Medicine, where we'll have a guided tour of the normal and pathological anatomy specimens on display. Examples of exhibits are wax models, plaster models, anatomical preparations in liquid, dried anatomical preparations injected with wax and dried skeletons and skulls.

Friday, June 20: The Hague and the Mauritshuis Museum.

In the morning, we'll travel by train (approximately 1-hour) to the charming city of **The Hague**. Here, we'll visit the **Mauritshuis Museum**, home to some of the best paintings from **The Dutch Golden Age**, including masterpieces such as **Vermeer's** *Girl with a Pearl Earring* and **Rembrandt's** *The Anatomy Lesson of Dr. Nicolaes Tulp*. After the visit, enjoy the rest of the day at leisure to explore the city, or head back to Amsterdam to visit other museums on your own, such as the Van Gogh Museum or the Anne Frank House.

Saturday, June 21: Rijksmuseum Guided Tour. Farewell Experience with Dinner.

In the morning, we'll visit the famous **Rijksmuseum** with our historian tour guide. The Rijksmuseum is considered the nation's temple of the arts. In our tour, attention is given to the museum's significance, which tells the story of 800 years of Dutch history, as well as its various masterpieces on different floors. The pinnacle is of course **Rembrandt's** *The Night Watch*, the most famous painting from the Dutch Golden Age. Enjoy the rest of the afternoon exploring personal interests. In the evening, join us for a very special **Farewell Experience**.
