

What is Process Art?

As we are preparing to celebrate the artist in each of our children you may be wondering..."What exactly is process art?" Here at All Saints School we facilitate "process" art rather than "product" art. That means that we are more interested in the process in which our children are creating rather than the end product that we see. Most preschoolers do not begin to produce "representational" art (art that looks like something real) until age four or five. Rather, children enjoy experiencing art for all of its attributes. They love to mix colors (which frequently produces brown artwork!) They like to experience the materials with a variety of senses which means that they will drop their brushes in favor of their hands and even arms or will notice the smell of glue, paint or crayons. They like to glue being used to learn about suspension rather than to stick things together. Many children are naturally driven to explore with visual arts and materials. Our teachers strive to act as facilitators who are ready to provide new materials, space and the most precious aspect...time to create.

Dear All Saints Family,


