Celebrate Rare Disease Day with All Saints School

Hello fellow All Saints families!

For those of you that do not know me, I'm the mom of Camden (Pre-k, Ms. Emory and Ms. Gena) and Brooks (Young 2's, Ms. Courtney and Ms. Lori). I'm also an Assistant Teacher with Ms. Cindy in the Young 1's. Fun fact number three, up until earlier this month my favorite National "holiday" was National Donut Day. Because, well, donuts! And, unlike other unique National days, there are two donut days. That's right, two. (June 7th and November 5th, for my fellow lovers of nutritionally bankrupt, frieddoughy goodness). As fun as having an excuse to eat donuts or wear pajamas to work is though, January put a new spin on my admiration of obscure holidays.

Have your child **wear** the Rare Disease Day colors: **purple**, **pink**, **blue** and **green**.

Send your child to school with a **\$1 to have his/her face painted!** All of the money raised will go to the NUBPL Foundation.

You see, in January we came to the end of a two year search for a diagnosis for our little guy Brooks. While many people look at Brooks and see an average 2 1/2 year old, Brooks actually has an abnormally small cerebellum with scarring throughout. He also has ataxia, hypotonia, and dysmetria. All of this we learned after setting out when Brooks was about six months old to determine why he was suddenly floppy and not keeping pace developmentally with his peers. Those findings, however, were only symptoms. What they were symptoms of eluded us and his physicians.

With the help of the genetics team at Arnold Palmer Hospital, early in January we finally obtained his diagnosis. Brooks has NUBPL, mitochondrial complex 1 deficiency, a progressive neurodegenerative disease that causes atrophy of the cerebellum, killing off cells daily.

The NUBPL mutation affecting Brooks is extremely rare. It was only discovered in 2010 and there are no FDA approved treatments. Because NUBPL affects such an incredibly small patient population, the impetus and funding for research is severely limited.

And, that is how Donut Day lost its glory to February 28th, Rare Disease Day. While the idea that a disease is rare implies few people are impacted, the reality is that 1 in 20 people will live with a rare disease at some point in their life. Despite this, there is no cure for the majority of rare diseases, including Brooks', and many go undiagnosed.

We'd love to share Rare Disease Day with our All Saints family and do something small to increase knowledge of rare diseases. In doing so, we'd also like to highlight NUBPL and raise some money toward funding for research of the disease. Every dollar donated to the NUBPL Foundation is filled with hope. Help us keep hope alive.


