ART



In art this week we created Ship Portals to decorate our door. We also made lighthouses for our land topography and to take home. These make great nightlights.



SCIENCE / SENSORY

We had a very exciting week of ocean science! We conducted a sink/float experiment using two oranges. We questioned: "Why is it that a peeled orange sinks even though it is lighter than an unpeeled orange?" We discovered: The secret lies in its peel. *Buoyancy* is the tendency of an object to float or sink in water or any other fluid. Whether an object is buoyant is determined by *Archimedes' Principle* which states that any object in a fluid is buoyed up by a force equal to the weight of the fluid displaced by the object. When the orange is placed in water there are two forces working upon it in opposite directions. We examined REAL sea creatures, including a fairly large Octopus! We observed our homemade aquarium daily to see what new pollution "found" its way into the water.



LANGUAGE / LITERACY

We used sequencing cards about a man going fishing to teach ordinal numbers, sequencing, and story order (beginning, middle, end). We also read *Rainbow Fish* stories that each present a social/moral situation that sparked discussion on right from wrong, being good leaders and making good choices. This month we will enjoy learning about spring and rainy weather. We began our discussion at the end of this week as we posed the question, "Why does it rain?" and "How is a cloud formed and why?".
