Weihenstephaner Pils Pilsner ♦ 5.1% ♦ Freising

Golden yellow and bright, with a distinctly strong aroma of hops and a pleasant bitterness. A uniquely hoppy pilsner many beer drinkers enjoy.

Weihenstephaner OG Helles Lager ♦ 5.1% ♦ Freising

With mild hoppy notes, this bright yellow lager has a pleasant, fresh spicy taste that pairs well with a wide array of food.

Weihenstephaner **Kristall** Kristallweizen ♦ 5.4% ♦ Freising

Golden yellow, this clear wheat beer has a fresh citrus flavour which harmonises well with its spicy banana notes.

Andechs Doppelbock ♦ 7.1% ♦ Andech

This world famous Bockbier from the Holy Mountain in Bavaria is to be savoured rather than downed. Has a dark copper colour with hints of fiery red. Bright, clear appearance and has a firm foam.

Bembel Apfel Kirsch Cider ♦ 4.2% ♦ Odenwald

With the dryness of an Apfelwein meets with a tantalising mix of summery cherries.

Possmann Pure Cider Cider ♦ 5% ♦ Frankfurt

A black currant rose, this cider has a clean and refreshing taste while maintaining some sweetness.

Frankfurter Äpfelwein Cider ♦ 5.5% ♦ Frankfurt

A crisp, clear wine with a tart, dry apple finish. Not at all like an angry orchard, but if you're looking for a dry cider, this is for you.

Lindemans Kreik Lambic ♦ 4% ♦ Viezenbeek, Belgium

With a deep red body, this lambic beer has a light pink foam and tart notes while remaining delicate and sweet.

Paulaner Salvator Doppelbock ♦ 7.5% ♦ München

Strong and malty, this bottom fermented Doppelbock unites the finest hopes and dark barley malts to create this Paulaner original which the monks used to serve as a replacement for food at Lent.

Gaffel Kölsch Kölsch ♦ 4.8% ♦ North Rhine Westphalia

Clear and straw yellow with a thick foam, this is a complex beer and the definition of a kölsch beer. Good level of hops without being too bitter.

Früh Kölsch Kölsch ♦ 4.8% ♦ Köln

Like champagne a proper Kölsch should come from Köln and this one does. Brewed in accordance with purity laws, this crisp, bright beer has some light pear notes and pairs well with many meals.

Radeberger Pilsner Pilsner ♦ 4.8% ♦ Frankfurt

The first brewery in Germany to exclusively brew pilsner style beers. Pours a clear, light yellow colour, with a huge head. Bready malts, and a light hops, has a slight bitterness at the end.

Stiegl Raspberry Radler Fruit Bier ♦ 2.5% ♦ Salzburg, Austria

Made with Stiegl Goldbräu lager, and another part raspberry juice. A bit more tart and sweet compared to the lemonade companion, it's still a very refreshing beverage.

Stiegl Lemon Radler Fruit Bier ♦ 2% ♦ Salzburg, Austria

Made with Stiegl Goldbräu lager, and another half lemonade. Similar to a summer shandy, and refreshing on hot days.

Schöfferhofer Grapefruit Hefeweizen ♦ 2.5% ♦ Frankfurt

A unique combination of sparkling wheat beer and refreshingly tangy grapefruit juice.

Żywiec IPA Pilsner ♦ 4.8% ♦ Żywiec, Poland

Thick and creamy with a moderately malty and bready, this hoppy beer isn't too bitter.
