As we go to "print" we are right around a hundred registrations with about two months yet to go, so our turn out should prove to make this one of the best attended GoF's in recent years!

For those who have registered, and for those who are considering joining with a wonderful group of people who just happen to have a bunch of fun MG cars, then we have some important information to share.

The Santa Maria Radisson Hotel has only 125 rooms, and in speaking with hotel staff this week they guarantee that the hotel will be fully booked during our July event. So, if you have registered for GoF, but have not reserved your room at the Radisson, please do it today. If you have not registered for GoF 2017, both register with us today and make sure you also call the Santa Maria Radisson to book your room. Wouldn't it be great to fill the entire hotel with friendly MG folks for this great multi-day MG event! Rooms at GoF West rates are only held until June 24th.

Our Santa Maria location was selected for FOUR reasons you will appreciate: COOL, CLOSE, NOT EXPENSIVE, and a FUN AREA.

COOL: We experience a coastal westerly breeze from the ocean which provides us with very moderate Summer temperatures, usually in the mid to high 70's, NOT HOT, which is perfect for top down driving in our non airconditioned *MG*'s. We sometimes get evening coastal fog, so even though it's Summer, bring a jacket!

CLOSE: Santa Maria is a short driving distance for the vast population areas within California where many MG owners live. Within a half day drive you can arrive here from the L.A. area, from the Central Valley centers of Fresno and Bakersfield, from the Silicon Valley areas around San Jose and the San Francisco Bay Area. For hundreds of California MG owners this means an easy and relaxing drive.

NOT EXPENSIVE: We were able to obtain terrific room rates for this GoF. Contact the Hotel by phone and consider enjoying the discounted room rate by coming early or staying extra days.

FUN: Santa Maria is close to Pismo Beach and Santa Barbara, as well as the Danish tourist town of Solvang





and the beautiful Santa Ynez Valley wine country. The Standing Sun Winery in Buellton is offering 2 for 1 wine tasting and opening special for GoF Rallye particpants. Santa Barbara is home to Moss Motors, and they have offered us a tour of their facilities and a discount coupon for parts and accessories for those desiring a visit.

The GoF itself will kick-off on Monday with a First Timer Car Display and Welcome Dinner of famous Santa Maria style Bar-b-Que. Tips from a British Car Mechanic

Malcolm Buckeridge was raised in Norfolk England and started as a British Mechanic Apprentice in 1960. The shop specialized in British vintage, pre-war, and early post war sports cars. In 1970 he moved to a company that specialized in the



restoration of vintage, pre-war, and early post-war Rolls Royces. In 1992 Malcolm and his wife Joy emigrated to California, opening a business specializing in the repair and servicing of older British Cars.

Malcolm has some tricks and tidbits he'd like to share with maintaining your MG and keeping it on the road.

Malcolm and Joy closed up shop and moved to the Big Bear area in 2013. So now, semiretired, Malcolm is a vintage British car mobile mechanic choosing to work just a few days a week. He is a TC owner although he's probably owned most every type of British car at one time or another. Come to his tech session Wednesday afternoon. He is a bit taciturn, so come and get him talking. He has great stories of how when parts are not available he has MacGyvered solutions to get a vehicle home.

Photos, Models, Art, Crafts, Sewn Goods, Collections

It's time to show off those prized MG photos, knickknacks, creative works, sewn goods and other dust catchers. The general interest photo competition covers a broad area such as your favorite photos taken at a GoF, club car rallies, club events, car restorations, creative car shots along the road or at home, and seasonal pictures of the MG in snow or amidst fall leaves. These photos can be framed, stand-alones, or displayed

with a mat board.

Model Competition

Most of us have a model replica of our car plus additional models. Grab one for the single model competition or several (up to 10) and enter the model display category. Pack them carefully and place in a niche in the car or luggage. Always room for a little more.





If you feel really creative and have extra space in your car, put together an MG diorama, which involves a scene such as a English home surrounded with MGs; a garage featuring



mechanics working on MG's; a race track with MGs; a beach scene with MGs; or a replica GoF car display. There are a lot of possibilities.

MG Collection

This category requires more than one item, so if you are an MG pin collector, this is perfect for your entry. Or if you have collected MG stamps, key fobs, patches, thimbles,





tea and coffee cups you get the idea. Or if you want to be creative, put together a collage of a little of each of the above. Here's your chance to get some

mileage out of your hard earned collection.

Art and/or Craft Category

Whether you paint from numbers or are talented enough to create your own painting, this is your chance to show off your talent. Past winners have involved charcoal drawings and special paintings of MG related scenes. Also, if you create other crafts such as painted bowls and dishes, sculptures, jewelry or wood created items, the craft category is anxious to accommodate you.

Sewn Goods

Based on past GoFs, we know there are many talented seamstresses in MG circles. Amazing entries have included needle work on pillows or framed works, homemade articles of clothing and embroidered items. This category is a crowd pleaser and has always created oohs and aws.

A ll items must be placed in the competition Sunday and Monday. Voting will open Tuesday and end at noon on Thursday. All items should be picked up Thursday afternoon.

than a thousand miles (one way) during our years as MG owners have a "kit" prepared for most scenarios.

First, Moss Motors, the largest supplier of parts for our classic cars, is just 60 miles away from our event hotel. Moss has graciously offered to BRING parts directly to us should anyone have a mechanical failure and need parts during our event. Moss will be presenting one of our technical sessions and the company has employees who live in Santa Maria and commute to work at their facility in Santa Barbara. Thus, they have provided us with a very special offer in helping to prevent

a stranded MG driver at our GOF by getting parts to us ASAP. This offer would avoid the couple of days needed for a UPS or FEDEX delivery and get you back on the road for our rallye,



funkhana, or just to save you extra time in the hotel waiting for parts before you head home.

Also, we have a local British mechanic at Absolutely British right here in Santa Maria. The owner, Eric, has stated he would help with any needed repairs at his

shop if the job couldn't be done by GOF attendees at our hotel site. We also have an excellent repair and restoration shop just 45 miles away in San Luis Obispo, British Sports Cars, and Peter and his son Justin also have a Moss authorized parts department on site.

Traveling Home from GoF West 2016

n the Friday at the end of a thoroughly enjoyable week at the 2016 GoF West at Eagles Crest Resort we (Will & Sara) made a leisurely start and after saying goodbye to fellow Bakersfield Car Club Members and TD Owners, Geoff and Barbara who were heading off into the wilds of Idaho, we refueled our TD with some excellent Oregon car food in the form of ethanol free gas and set off for a leisurely day's drive to our planned overnight stop in a hotel with a brewpub just along the road in Susanville. Our planned drive home over two days and two overnight stops would get us back home in time for the July 4th festivities in Bear Valley that were taking place over the weekend.

Heading south we got the TD's final fix of ethanol free just before leaving Oregon and later stopped to watch a herd of antelope in the field beside the road, which upset the only vehicle to pass along the road whilst we were doing this, the local CHP who told us that we

were a hazard to traffic because we had not pulled far enough off the road! We then continued happily on southwards until midafternoon, when our cell phones started beeping frantically with messages that a brushfire that started on the Arvin road to the west of Bear Valley was threatening the woods and houses in Bear Valley and that our house was in the "Advisory Evacuation" area.

Not feeling that we would sleep comfortably in hotel rooms for the next two nights whilst our house burned down

without trying to recover vital documents and valuables, we decided to drive straight home as quickly as possible.

Our planned overnight stop in Susanville became a short one, no brewpub for us, just a quick refuel (E10 - Yuk - "the TD"), a takeaway pizza and two large mugs of iced tea. I doubted the dynamo on the TD would sustain the battery on the car for a full night's driving as the charging rate was down and fixing it had not been a priority at the GoF. So we held off switching on the lights until well after sunset, which saw us on the northern outskirts of Reno, heading south along Highway 395. In built up areas we drove on sidelights to conserve the battery and refueled with the engine running and lights off, to try to recharge the battery. As most of the journey was through dark unpopulated areas, we still had to use the headlights even though they were progressively draining the battery.

Part of our battery saving strategy was to drive closely behind trucks using only sidelights using their lights to see the way. This must have puzzled the truck drivers and made them wonder if the CHP was tailing them as they all drove at exactly 55 MPH while we were behind. As each truck turned off, probably to get rid of us, we drove on faster, cruising at about 65 MPH, hoping to cover as many miles as possible whilst the battery lasted.

After about fourteen hours of continuous travelling since leaving



Redmond, we arrived in Bishop in the small hours and it was apparent that not only was the battery completely finished but so was I. After refueling we stopped in Dennys and had a cup of hot chocolate each before returning to the car planning to re-start

TD if you have long legs! When we awoke, somewhat worryingly, the car park was full of fire trucks whilst their occupants were grabbing an early breakfast in Dennys. Fortunately a kind gentleman coming in for his breakfast gave us a jump start using the cables that were actually where they were supposed to be.

> Heading off in the first light of dawn we were passed periodically by convoys of fire trucks including those we had seen at Dennys earlier. We were travelling between sixty and sixty five miles per hour but the fire trucks were going considerably faster raising our worry level progressively higher.

Arriving in Tehachapi at 9am we stopped to refuel as we wanted to be sure of having enough gas in the car to cover any eventualities. As we were topping up the tank our cell phones beeped with messages telling us the evacuation was now

mandatory. Worry level went off the scale! Fortunately we were now able to link up with some good friends, who came with us to our house, and helped to grab a few valuables throw them into the cars and we drove all the drivable cars out to safety before the access to the valley was cut off. Fortunately our dogs were staying at the Pet Lodge in town, so we did not have to worry about them.

As luck would have it, the winds that had fanned the Erskine Fire, which had been raging around Lake Isabella to the north of our home area, had been brought under control releasing the resources needed to fight the fire threatening our home. So a total of over 1000 fire fighters, several dozen fire trucks from all over the region, two fire retardant bomber planes and twelve helicopter water bombers working in shifts 24 hours a day were able to contain the fire threatening not just our house but many more throughout the area and then after 48 hours the evacuation order was lifted. Thanks to the outstanding work by the Firefighters, we were able to return home, even though the firefighting work continued for several days.

As one can imagine, the July 4th Festivities in Bear Valley were literally overshadowed by the pall of smoke from the fire and the constant stream of helicopters picking up water from the lake in the valley to spray on the fire.

The thanks of all the residents of Bear Valley go to the Firefighters who worked non-stop for five days to bring the fire that threatened our homes under control.

And the TD? After its 820 mile dash averaging nearly 50 MPH including the times spent re-fueling but not the three hour sleep, it had a quick battery re-charge and a thorough wash. The next weekend we drove it down to the Central Coast British Car Club meeting at Oxnard, a mere three hour drive away, where it won First Prize in the T-Series class!

This 1938 MG VA Tickford will be shown at GoF West this year by Bob & Donna Hanselman. A brief history of this car tells that the restoration process was started in 2005 by Lou Louchous of Rolling Meadows, Ill. Lou passed on the purchase of the car 3 times before finally deciding to attempt the restoration, due to the bad deterioration. He spent two and half years to complete the car, working almost every day of the week. He

did most of the work himself in his home garage. The motor work and upholstery was done by other sources. The construction is a wood sub-frame covered with a metal skin. As most of the wood was beyond using, it did provide enough for patterns. Some of the new timber came from a source in Hull, England. That is also a problem in restoring pre-war foreign cars. If you can find the parts, it can be a long wait with the shipping period. Bob pursued the car for last 8 years. He would call Lou every so often and tell him he was getting another year older and would not be able to enjoy his work. Never thinking the day would come that the Tickford would be offered, Bob obtained another VA car. That model is a 1937 VA Tourer which was built as a police car for the Lancashire Police Force, but that is another story. Eventually Lou sold the VA to Bob & Donna. They look forward to you viewing and talking about their 1938 Tickford at GoF West 2017.



Why MG built the VA

In the early 30's, a new trend was emerging in the British sport car market, away from out and out sports cars, toward a new type of more comfortable and luxurious cars suitable for year-round use in all kinds of weather, but still with higher-than-average performance. Thus the birth of the SVW MG cars.

The first in the series was the introduction of the SA Two-Litre saloon at the 1935 Motor Show. The reception of the SA saloon was encouraging. MG published a Two-Litre brochure which promised an alternative body style on the SA chassis — a "Tickford" drophead coupe with a body by Salmons & Sons. An announcement was made of a third body style in January 1936, when an artist"s impression was published of a four-door four seater open tourer with a body by Charlesworth of Coventry.

From the start, it was planned that the Two-Litre should have a little brother. Kimber stated that planning for the 11/2 liter VA-type began as early as September 1935, even before the Two-litre had been launched. The engineering and design of the VA followed almost exactly the principles established with the SA, but the dimensions were shrunk all around. There were two reasons for bringing out such a car as the VA. Firstly, MG wanted a new medium-sized car, and secondly, Abingdon was again looking at the competition.

The VA was announced in October 1936 and the preliminary sales brochure carried artist's impressions of all three body styles. The prices announced were 280 pounds for the tourer, 325 pounds for the saloon, and 335 pounds for the drophead coupe.

The VA issue ledger shows that before VA production ended in late 1939, there was a total of 2,407 cars built. There were 564 that wore the elegant "Tickford" body and 64 still survive world wide. This rare surviving example of the VA Tickford was fully restored in 2007 and may be the only one you're likely to see.

The third in the series was known as the WA (larger than the SA), and it also carried the three body styles as both the SA and VA.
