San Diego is Waiting For You!!

Yes, folks, the fabulous Bahia Resort and the City of San Diego is indeed waiting for you, and the GoF West 2014 Committee has an outstanding event that will be well worth the wait. But, it is coming up very soon, so, if you have not yet made your reservations for the event and the hotel, you had better do so quickly; hotel rooms are going fast at this time.

The event will be held August 24th through the 29th. San Diego is the birthplace of California and is known for its mild year-round climate, natural deep-water harbor, and extensive beaches.

The selected venue for this GoF West event is located on Mission Bay, the largest water park of its kind in the world; it comprises 4,200 acres in roughly equal parts of land and water, surrounded by 27 miles of meandering shoreline of sandy beaches, interconnected by a network of waterways, inlets and islets.

The Bahia Resort Hotel is secluded on a 14-acre peninsula along the shores of Mission Bay, just 1 block from Mission Beach and a short ride from Pacific Beach. You'll enjoy the picturesque natural beauty of the Bahia Hotel. It offers an unparalleled quality that sets it apart



from so many other San Diego hotels, and at a special bargain at only \$135 a night for MG attendees. As San Diego's premier family vacation destination, they pride themselves on making the most of the exquisite bay setting and location in San Diego, America's Finest City. Guests can enjoy the city and the major local attractions as easily as they do the beach and bay.

A private, sandy beach and private marina are on site. A large outdoor pool and spa tub are surrounded by pink stucco walls and palm trees. Overlooking the pool, a





small fitness center provides cardio and strength-training equipment. Two lighted tennis courts include use of complimentary equipment. A scheduled boat cruise on Mission Bay is complimentary.

The Pacific Ocean is 4 blocks away. The adjacent Mission Bay Aquatic Park offers an array of water sports, including pedal boats, kayaks, ski boats,



FUNKHANA FEVER



Funkhana is one of the highlights of any GoF West Event. For those that have attended this is undisputable. For those yet to attend the very word is unknown or meaningless. The normal response is.... Huh? What the heck is a Funkhana? Can you spell that? Let's take a look.

It is speculated that the word is derived in part from the term **Gymkhana**. A Gymkhana is a type of timed motorsport or speed event in an automobile. These can feature obstacles such as cones, tires, and barrels. The driver must maneuver through a predetermined "track" performing many different driving techniques. What separates gymkhana from the similar traditional autocross event is that the gymkhana requires drivers to perform reversals, 180 degree spins, 360 degree spins, parking boxes, figure 8s, and other *advanced* skills.

It is surmised that in the 1950's it was found that many lacked the skill or equipment to excel in the "one car at a time" **Gymkhana** races. So the pace was slowed, *unusual* obstacles were added, and the competition was made less serious. The intent was to have fun, and hence the name **Funkhana**. This event evolved into an automotive social function of sorts that was now fun for the whole family.

Today the **Funkhana**, remains a "themed" driving event to test advanced skills on a predetermined track with various obstacles and driving events. Each Team, composed of a driver and navigator, must complete the course events which can range from challenging to silly. Teams are graded on time, accuracy, and points. With a little luck and sense of humor, everyone has a chance of winning.

GoF West 2014 has a planned Funkhana that you will not want to miss.

GOF WEST AWARDS CRITERIA



Here is what you will need to know attending GoF West 2014:

Please take a moment to study the criteria for the different awards that are presented at the end of the week. This will help you to **prepare**, **participate and win!**

First Time Car Display - Day 1 (evening)

Open to any registrant who has never displayed a car at a previous GoF West event. Popular vote.

Car Display - Day 2

Popular vote for cars within the following classes: MMM 4-Cylinder, MMM 6-Cylinder, TA/TB, TC, TD, TF, Variant (YA/B/T, Magnette, Arnolt), MGA, MGB/MGC/Midget, and Premier.

Premier Class - Pre-56 MGs only. Eligibility is for 3 consecutive GoF Wests after winning Class. Upon winning Premier, car reverts to "For Display Only" status for remaining eligibility period. There will be only one award presented regardless of number of entrants.

Rallve - Dav 3

Awards will be given to the Driver and Navigator for 2 separate classes: Pre-56 and Modern. For those that struggle with this event, you can compete for the not so coveted "Dead Last But Finished" (DLBF) Award.

Funkhana - Day 4

Awards will be given to the Driver and Navigator for 3 different classes: TC and earlier (cart sprung), TD/TF & Variant (coil sprung) and Modern. (Do not miss participating in this event at the hotel).)

Al Moss Memorial High Point Award

Perpetual Award presented to pre-56 MG participants who have accumulated the highest cumulative score for the three competitive events of **Car Display**, **Funkhana and Rallye**. Participants must enter all three events to be considered for the High Point Award. The same registered car and driver/navigator combination must be maintained for all events. No switching of car and/or drivers.

Mileage Awards

Presented to any driver and navigator who drove one-way in an MG for 1000 or 2000 miles.

Long Distance Award

Award given to participant who drove a pre-56 MG the farthest distance within 5 days of the start of event determined by calculated mileage measured from residence to the event.

Sacajawea Award

Award presented to lady driver who drove a pre-56 MG the farthest distance within 5 days of the start of event determined by calculated mileage measured from residence to the event.

STEERING COMMITTEE MIN-UTES

Tele-Conference - 19 May 2014

The meeting began at 7:07 pm. Present were Lawrie Alexander, Dave Bradley, Mike Campbell, Doug Pelton, Pete Thelander and Lindsay Costigan.

GoF West 2013

Mike Campbell confirmed the receipt of final report on 2013 Carefree and check for proceeds has been deposited. Also a thank you letter and honorarium has been sent to the Road Runners.

GoF West 2014

and Doug will post on the web site. There will be one more promotional email sent to clubs in the western states. Mike Campbell reported 91 Registrations to date and that about 20 San Diego locals will probably not be booking rooms, but stay at home. This created some concern about our commit-

20 San Diego locals will probably not be booking rooms, but stay at home. This created some concern about our commitment for rooms to the hotel. There followed a discussion as to our ability to release rooms, how many and when. Dave checked the contract and the first opportunity for us to release up to 33 rooms is May 24th. Mike and Dave will check on the number of rooms reserved to date and decide whether or not to release any.

Mike and Dave reported that all the events that their respective clubs are responsible for are well under way. The booklet is also being worked on.

GoF West 2015

Previous issues with the 2015 contract were addressed by George and Lawrie and revisions submitted 12/1. The revised contract has been received and signed

Lindsay reported that the logo has been designed. Meals at Doubletree have been selected using the subsidy from Steering Committee and from registration fees. The Auction Dinner tickets will be \$35, Awards Banquet tickets \$50. Registration fee has been set at \$65. Promotional material is being prepared, including a DVD to be shown at 2014. Copies will be made available to 2014 participants. Copies will be sent to all car clubs likely to have MG enthusiasts interested in attending 2015. A dozen or so MGs from Canada already committed to attend. John Twist has agreed to attend and present one of his Rolling Tech Sessions. We'll give him one of our comp'ed

rooms and tickets for both dinners. All committees are actively planning and budget is being prepared.

Staffing

A replacement is needed for George on S.C. and Mike's term also expires this year. Dave and Doug's terms expire in 2015, with Lawrie and Pete in 2016. The question was asked if we were aware of any volunteers or recommendations for election at 2014 Advisory Council meeting. The call for volunteers or nominees will be included in the planned email to the participating clubs in the region.

Web Site & Gazette

Doug said he will be tidying up the administration for the web site, posting the DVDs for 2014 and 2015. It was suggested that Steering Committee minutes also be posted. There are currently three email data bases in use. Doug has a general interest list of about 1000 people who have attended in the past, and a much shorter list of the key people in the West Coast MG clubs and other organizations that might have an interest in GoF West. Additionally, Mike has a list of those registered for 2014.

Larry Long has agreed to take over responsibility for the Gazette publication and intends to release one more issue as soon as possible.

GoF West 2016

Potential locales for GoF 2016 were discussed. Mike mentioned that Larry Long might be interested possibly in Pismo Beach.

By-Laws

Larry Long is known to not favor including the "modern" MGs, partly because our By-Laws say so. Lawrie pointed out that the A, B and C groups have their own national meets, but that they are held largely in the eastern states. Lawrie suggested changing the By-Laws to allow participation by all years and models of MG, and this will be included on the agenda for the SC meeting at San Diego.

Treasurer's Report

Mike presented the Treasurer's report. There was a discussion of what was the appropriate use of this money. Principal suggestions were to provide a cushion or "rainy day" fund and subsidize GoF meals.

Meeting adjourned at 8:26

62nd Annual Rallye Glenwood Springs June 13-15, 2014

The MG Car Club - Rocky Mountain Centre invites you to join us for the 62nd Annual Rallye Glenwood Springs, the oldest continually-held time-speed-distance rally in the United States, on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, June 13, 14, & 15, 2014.

The weekend is a marvelous opportunity, not just for MG owners, but for sports car enthusiasts of every mark (British, American, German, Italian, Japanese) to come together for sunny days, cool nights, and unique events. The fun begins on Friday with a scenic road tour from the Denver suburb of Arvada, touring through canyons and over mountain passes in the heart of the Rocky Mountains to the scenic resort town of Glenwood Springs. Added this year is a concurrent tour, the Western Slope Tour. Saturday's main event is the Rallye Glenwood Springs, a time-speed-distance rally to challenge both novice and experienced rallyists. Spend the day winding through the beautiful mountain valleys around Glenwood Springs. The weekend culminates with a social gathering Saturday night and the Car Show, Funkana, and Awards Presentation on Sunday.

Since its inception, the MGCC-RMC has sponsored the Rallye, which began when a hardy group of sports car owners discovered the joys of motoring in Colorado in MGs that still had drop-down tops and running boards (see photo). The Rocky Mountains of central Colorado, with some of the most breathtaking scenery in America, formed the backdrop for the Rallye Glenwood Springs through 61 previous years. Vintage and classic cars from as far away as California and Illinois have shared the twisting mountain roads with their newer counterparts for octane-related festivities. And enthusiasts have come from as far away as England to drive their sports cars through such fabled Colorado mining towns as Leadville and Aspen on their way to Glenwood Springs.

Registration is only \$45 for all the driving events and the car show (before May 15; social event and regalia are extra).
