

GoF West 2019**Monday, August 12 through Friday, August 16****Hang On, Folks ! We're Almost There!!**

Well, folks, all I can say is that if you didn't read the last issue of the GoF Gazette, you need to go back and read it and find out what a really great event GoF West 2019 is going to be. Mike Campbell and I (Co-Chairs of the event) were down at the Prescott Resort and Conference Center just a month ago to review all of the plans with the hotel personnel, and I'm here to tell you that they are really working with us. They are bending over backwards to give us everything that we have asked for and we are not having to pay a penny for the use of any of the special rooms in the hotel. In fact, we are going to be taking over the entire hotel, and what a magnificent place it is. As I said in the last Gazette, we would be hard pressed to find a better venue than the Prescott Resort and Conference

Center. We are very pleased with the staff; they have been helping us with everything we need.

This is going to be a really good event. Let me just recap what we are going to be doing. The event will run from Monday, August 12 through Friday, August 16. We will have our normal functions such as the car display,



the funkhana, the rally, the display of arts and crafts, and the two dinners: the auction banquet and the awards dinner. Mike and I ate at the restaurant several times while we were there last month, and both of us agree that the food is really, really good. I know that we can expect the same quality at our dinners. To top it off, the meals are not expensive. In fact, they are a lot less than we have seen at other hotels over the past several years.

It may be a little warm in August driving across the desert, but we have been assured that the temperature in Prescott is at least 20° cooler than it is in Phoenix. And we know that this time of year is monsoon season, but we have been told that most of the rain during this season happens in the evening. So hopefully we will be able to conduct all functions we want to do during the day time without any rain problems.



The Prescott Resort and Conference Center is a really nice place. The hotel accommodations offer privacy and comfort in spacious deluxe guestrooms and suites, each with its own private balcony to capture the majestic views. Each room was created to represent the symbols of Yavapai Prescott Indian tribe. To make your stay more comfortable, the hotel offers microwaves upon request, coffee maker with complimentary coffee, flat screen television, complimentary wireless high-speed internet access, and more. We will have our own spacious hospitality suite—I mean it is really spacious and will be very comfortable for all of us MG travelers to relax with our friends old and new

Deluxe rooms are offered at only \$99 and the suites are at \$109. You can have a triple or quad suite at \$119 or \$129 per night. All rooms are subject to 12.6% surcharge. These are the lowest rates we've seen for several years, especially for first-class resorts such as this.

I have included a copy of the revised agenda in this Gazette. We may still make a few minor adjustments, but basically the agenda will be as you see it. There will be registration on Monday and again on Tuesday morning. You will be able to pick up your goodie bag with all of the meal tickets that you ordered. The goodie bag is a little bit different than what you seen it in previous years and we think that you are going to really like it. It'll be good for not only carrying your goodies around during the event, but good to use after you leave the event.

Regalia is going to be sold ahead of time, so be sure to check out the flyer that is included in this Gazette. The regalia items are quality merchandise so you don't need to be concerned about having any cheap T-shirts or polos. In fact, we chose a high quality polo and are selling those shirts for less than our cost.



The hotel staff has been working with us to provide really high quality meals at a very reasonable price. You can order both the Auction Buffet and the Awards Banquet meals at the same time for a savings of \$10 over the cost if you order those meals individually. We do hope that you will take advantage of that. Mike and I met the chef at our meeting there and we tasted some of the things that he has planned; I know that you will not be disappointed.

Orientation will be on Monday evening with the First Timers car display. Here you will find out everything that you need to know about the hotel, the surrounding community and where you can see things in the general area of Prescott. Dinner will be on your own.

The hotel manager has graciously allowed us to have our First Timer's car display and the Winners Circle on the patio behind the hotel. It's not used for that



very often and it's going to be a really nice venue because it is right outside the Granite Mountain Room where we will have our orientation.

When Mike and I were at the hotel we also spent one day with the people from Arizona that are working with us to make this an enjoyable event. It has been very difficult to find a group of people or a club that is willing to work to chair a GoF event. Mike and I decided to go ahead and plan this one and to do it having the faith that we will find people to help. I'm telling you that the Arizona people sure did come forward to help!! We have people from three different Arizona car clubs that have jumped in to tend to all the little tasks that have to be done. We have one person putting together the rally, one doing the car display and a couple of people putting together different technical sessions.

These people are MG folks---the nicest people you will find anywhere. One of the ladies is putting together a couple of "technical sessions", one of which will be a family session that will be held on Monday afternoon. This will include a presentation by people from the Charlotte Hall Museum in Prescott. It will be family oriented, not just for men or women, but the children as well. And she is planning to have a scarf making session as well.

Tuesday morning will be the car display. We have a fellow from Prescott that knows the mayor and a lot of people in the Chamber of Commerce, and he has arranged with the mayor to have the car display in downtown Prescott at the courthouse square, only about 2-1/2 miles from the hotel. It will be an easy drive to get there; in fact you could just put your car neutral and coast almost all the way down to the car display area.

On the other side of the courthouse square where we will have the car display is Whiskey Row, the famous historical section of Prescott. You should have plenty of time to take a look at this historic district.

At the Chamber of Commerce building right across the street from the car display is a kiosk where you can sign up for a walking tour or a golf cart tour of downtown Prescott. All you have to do is push the button and soon



the golf cart will come and pick you up to show you downtown Prescott. You could do that while the car display is going on or in the afternoon.

On Wednesday we will have our rally in the area around the Prescott area. The hospitality room and the arts and crafts room will be open sometime during the afternoon. We will have a tech session in the afternoon and the Family Tea. If you don't want to hear about car stuff in the technical session you can attend the Family Tea. And then in the evening will be the silent auction and the dinner followed by the live auction.

On Thursday morning we will have the autojumble (flea market), the funkhana and the carless funkhana, and, hopefully, the valve cover race. We are still trying to find someone to host that. I will send out the valve cover racing rules in a separate email if we decide to have it.

IMPORTANT

On Thursday afternoon we will have our Advisory Council and the Steering Committee meetings. These are very important meetings, so please plan to attend them. In the evening we will have our Awards Banquet and presentation of the awards.

On Friday we will have the winners circle out on the patio, along with a continental breakfast. We then will have to say goodbye to our friends, old and new, and wish them well for the coming year.

If you haven't signed up for the 2019 GoF West event yet, it is not too late to do so. You can go to gof-west.org online and download a registration form or use the one that's in this Gazette. Send it directly to Mike Campbell; his address is on the form. If you want to order your meals and regalia at the same time, you can do that as well.

Remember to clean out your garage and bring (or

send) all of that high quality MG merchandise (please—no greasy items) for the auction. This is the event that brings us the funds to

support this year's event and provides funds to kick off next year's event.

We wish you safe travels as you come to the GoF, and we look forward to seeing you again this year, or meeting you if you haven't been to you before. And we want to remind you that GoF West is open to all models of MG regardless of the year or the model. You are all invited to come and have a good time.
