## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Code Section 16-13-2 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to conditional discharge for possession of controlled substances as first offense and certain nonviolent property crimes, dismissal of charges, and restitution to victims, so as to authorize counties to adopt ordinances governing and punishing the possession of one ounce or less of marijuana in the unincorporated areas of a county; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

## **SECTION 1.**

9 Code Section 16-13-2 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to conditional
10 discharge for possession of controlled substances as first offense and certain nonviolent
11 property crimes, dismissal of charges, and restitution to victims, is amended by revising
12 subsection (b) as follows:

13 "(b)(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this Code section, Notwithstanding any
 14 law to the contrary, any person who is charged with possession of marijuana, which
 15 possession is of one ounce or less, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punished by

16	imprisonment for a period not to exceed 12 months or a fine not to exceed \$1,000.00, or
17	both, or public works not to exceed 12 months.
18	(2) The governing authority of each county is authorized to adopt ordinances governing
19	the possession of one ounce or less of marijuana within the unincorporated areas of the
20	county. Violation of such ordinances may be punished by fines, and each such ordinance
21	shall specify the maximum punishment which may be imposed for a violation of the
22	ordinance. In no case shall the maximum punishment for the violation of any such
23	ordinance exceed a fine of \$1,000.00. Any fines and bond forfeitures arising from the
24	prosecution of such cases shall be retained by the county and shall be paid into the
25	treasury of such county."

27 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
