Finishing the Year Strong

Did you know that donors in the United States give 35% of their gifts between Thanksgiving and New Year's Eve? And 10% are given in the last 3 days of the year? We want to make sure that your ministry is well-positioned to receive some of those gifts.

Even if you have just finished your stewardship appeal, there are still donors in your congregation who are able and willing to make a special year-end gift. Their favorite nonprofit organizations are soliciting those year-end gifts. Many donors don't even think about their church at the end of the year because no effort has been made to invite those gifts. The fundamental steps of informing, inspiring, inviting, and thanking still apply. So, when inviting end-of-year gifts, make sure that you are specific as possible about how those gifts will be used. Simply stating that "end-of-year gifts will be used to avoid a deficit this year" inspires no one. Highlighting a specific ministry that is changing people's lives for the better is far more inspirational and will excite your donors to be more generous.

At year's end, there are several special ways that donors choose to give. Taking time and making the effort to remind your donors through your general communication channels, of these methods can make a significant difference in the ministry of your church. These include:

- Giving a qualified charitable distribution (QCD), a form of gift that is given in place of the donor's required minimum distribution from their IRA. These donors must be 70 ½ years or older and can give up to \$100,000 per person annually in this manner.
- Some donors may wish to give gifts of stock to your church. Make sure that your congregation has a plan in place to receive stock and to sell it as soon as possible.

Other reminders are best delivered with directed personal communication, such as a letter or email.

- Invite your donors to complete their gift intents from last year on a timely basis, or to let the church office know if they will be unable to do so.
- Invite those who have given nothing to the church throughout the year to consider making a special year-end gift, again focused on a specific ministry.

Bringing these opportunities for additional generosity to the forefront will ensure that your ministry ends 2022 in a position of strength and ready to launch into an even better 2023.
