Pray that we will always be learning and reforming, discerning how to do God's work in a diverse world, and inviting and equipping one another for this essential work.
- **2** Pray for seasonal workers who depend on summer income for their livelihood, that they will find safe, fulfilling employment that pays a fair wage. Pray that we will express our gratitude and respect for their work and service.
- **3** Remember in prayer the leaders, voting members and others gathering online for the assemblies of the Upstate New York and North Carolina synods, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them in choosing leaders, proclaiming the gospel, growing the church, serving our neighbor and doing God's work in an ever-changing world.
- 4 Remember in prayer the leaders, voting members and others gathering online for the assemblies of the Western North Dakota, Southwest California, Central/Southern Illinois, Montana, Delaware-Maryland, Metropolitan Washington, D.C., south Dakota, Central States, Southern Ohio, Allegheny and Lower Susquehanna synods, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them in choosing leaders, proclaiming the gospel, growing the church, serving our neighbor and doing God's work in an ever-changing world.

- 6 Remember in prayer the leaders, voting members and others gathering online for the assembly of the Southwestern Minnesota Synod, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them in choosing leaders, proclaiming the gospel, growing the church, serving our neighbor and doing God's work in an everchanging world.
- **7** Give thanks that through grace, faith in Christ and obedience to the will and ways of God we are embraced as children of God, siblings in Christ.
- **8** Pray for nations experiencing repeated waves of COVID-19 infection and communities impacted and struggling, and pray that their health care workers, medical facilities and efforts to vaccinate as many people as possible will slow the pandemic.
- **9** Pray that we will be patient and attentive to how God answers our prayers and speaks to us, especially in ways we do not seek or expect.
- 10 Remember in prayer the leaders, voting members and others gathering online for the assembly of the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them in choosing leaders, proclaiming the gospel, growing the church, serving our neighbor and doing God's work in an everchanging world.



- 11 Remember in prayer the leaders, voting members and others gathering online for the assemblies of the Grand Canyon, Northeastern Ohio, La Crosse Area, Indiana-Kentucky, and Northwestern Pennsylvania synods, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them in choosing leaders, proclaiming the gospel, growing the church, serving our neighbor and doing God's work in an ever-changing world.
- 12 Remember in prayer the leaders, voting members and others gathering online for the assemblies of the New England, Virginia and Northeastern Iowa synods, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them in choosing leaders, proclaiming the gospel, growing the church, serving our neighbor and doing God's work in an ever-changing world.
- **13** When we read the parables of Jesus, we sometimes default to rote explanations of their meaning. Pray that we will hear and read Scripture with hearts and minds open to learning, insight and fresh connection to our daily life.
- 14 Give thanks for ELCA resources that nurture our faith and spiritual growth during times of physical distancing, including *Living Lutheran* magazine, blogs and newsletters, daily Bible readings and ELCA World Hunger's at-home vacation Bible school program guide.
- **15** "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" Give thanks and praise to God for reminding us that we are made new each day through God's mercy and grace.
- **16** Pray for the Spirit to inspire us to create and share new expressions of our faith and theology through art, music and writing that speak to all generations and the diverse contexts of people in our communities.
- **17** Give thanks all day long to God for God's unwavering love and the joy and hope it stirs within us, which overflows to the people around us.

- 18 Remember in prayer the leaders, voting members and others gathering online for the assemblies of the Northern Illinois and Caribbean synods, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them in choosing leaders, proclaiming the gospel, growing the church, serving our neighbor and doing God's work in an everchanging world.
- 19 Remember in prayer the leaders, voting members and others gathering online for the Upper Susquehanna Synod Assembly, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them in choosing leaders, proclaiming the gospel, growing the church, serving our neighbor and doing God's work in an ever-changing world.
- **20** Pray that God's power, presence and love will ease our fears and uncertainties, calm the storms in our lives and strengthen our faith so that we will be bold and tireless disciples who do God's work in the world, share the gospel and serve our neighbor.
- 21 Remember in prayer fathers who strive to be loving, caring, wise and influential parents, including fathers who are new parents or single parents, who are deployed in the military or incarcerated, or who experience separation from family while traveling for their work.
- **22** Give thanks and praise for God's great works and attention to our prayers, both when we are alone and when we gather as a community of faith.
- 23 Pray for the 300-plus health and human service organizations of the Lutheran Services in America alliance, which serve 6 million people every year across our country in response to God's call to love our neighbors of all ages, needs and circumstances.
- **24** We acknowledge that it is not always easy to follow Christ, bear the gospel or do God's work in the world. Give thanks that together, as siblings in Christ, we can turn to one another with our burdens and receive support and encouragement.

- **25** Pause today and take in the wonders of God's creation. Give thanks for the joy, wonder and awesome complexity of nature and the universe, and ask God to help us be mindful, responsible and respectful stewards of creation.
- **26** Remember in prayer the leaders, voting members and others gathering online for the South Carolina Synod Assembly, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them in choosing leaders, proclaiming the gospel, growing the church, serving our neighbor and doing God's work in an ever-changing world.
- **27** Pray that we will serve our neighbors and invite others to believe and to join our communities of faith without bias, judgment, hesitation, obstruction or condition.

- **28** Pray for God's strength, comfort and vision when we are weary or overwhelmed or cannot see beyond times of despair; ask the Spirit to fill us with faith, hope and empathy so that we can support, care for and encourage our neighbors who are struggling.
- **29** Guided by the generous, compassionate and kind actions of Jesus, ask the Spirit to fill us with eagerness to work together and share our abundance with our neighbors so that all will have the resources, food and opportunities needed to thrive and be well.
- **30** Ask God to help us reflect on our nation, its history, its institutions and this church with honesty, humility, repentance and gratitude, united in our vision and determined to be more just, equitable, inclusive and responsive to our neighbors in need.



Let Your Thankfulness Show this Summer!

Consider what opportunity you may have to make a difference. Will it require more than you have ever considered before? Will it require a level of generosity, a level of stewardship, a level of radical hospitality that you have never contemplated?

A MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE BISHOP June 2021

Matthew 22:36-39 (NRSV)

36 "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" 37 He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' 38 This is the greatest and first commandment. 39 And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' 40 On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

As I write this article, we are just a few weeks away from the 2021 Synod Assembly, but as you read this, the Assembly may be over. During this day, in worship, in conversation, in the work we do together, we will have focused on the passage above and its seemingly simple ethic: Love God. Love People.

Hopefully, you have been inspired by stories about how God is getting this world loved through the words and actions of individuals, congregations, the Western North Dakota Synod, and the wider ELCA. You are a part of this amazing Love, because you are part of each of these expressions actively sharing God's love in the world.

As we move out of Synod Assembly, I invite you to a simple practice to carry the spirit of the assembly into your summer.

Find a place to sit quietly, maybe a favorite chair or a cozy bench in your backyard. Breathe deeply. Listen to the world around you and center your mind on the passage above. Read it a couple of times and let your mind wonder with God about what this passage is saying to you.

Now, fold a sheet of paper lengthwise. On one half, make a list of people in your community. Consider especially: People who have had a difficult year. People you don't know well. People you avoid or

choose not to engage. People you know who might be lonely or hurting.

Turn your paper over and on the other half count your blessings – list the talents, skills and positive characteristics that you possess, the relationships you have, the resources at your disposal. What do those closest to you appreciate most about you?

Now open your page and consider these two columns together. How might Love be made tangible in the lives of those listed through actions that grow out of the blessings in your life? Draw lines connecting your gifts with people who might need them. Jot down ideas for actions you could take using gifts you've been given to remind someone in your community that they are loved – by God and by you.

In his book *Martin Luther and the Called Life,* Dr. Mark Tranvik writes,

If we live faithfully within our callings, we find many occasions where love is needed. After all, Christ was one who crossed boundaries. Cultural and religious taboos were often broken as he reached out to the sick, the whores, and the tax collectors. As those whose identity is yoked with Christ, we also go to the "hard" places . . . And here we meet the very face of Christ as promised in Matthew 25:31-46. We do

not bring Christ to the world so much as we meet Christ in the world.¹

In many ways, the past 12-18 months have isolated us from one another. Quarantine, physical distancing, social media algorithms, differences of opinion, and the ability to choose like-minded conversation partners are just a few things that have allowed us to build caves of comfort where our own ideas, opinions, and fears are confirmed. And while these caves might feel safe and secure at first, they are really illusions that keep us from experiencing the fullness of the neighborhood in which Christ calls us to love and be loved.

So, consider your list, choose one action and go love somebody. May this summer be a time when we once again step outside and experience the Love of Christ made known in neighbor.
