### Six Rules for Science Writing





#### Write for your friends

Imagine your best friend is sitting in your dorm and they see a Scientifica magazine sitting on the table opened to your article. Would they want to read it? Would they be able to understand it? If you write what you care about, your curiosity will be contagious.



#### Question everything

Ask questions, ask questions about those questions, then ask some more questions about the answers to your questions. Include some of these questions in your writing! Do your research, use reliable resources, and fact-check yourself.



#### Murder jargon

We are not a peer-reviewed journal. Our job as writers is to communicate in the simplest words possible, so avoid technical language. Occasionally, a scientific idea will require a specific technical term, in which case, simply explain the term.



#### Data is sexy

Use facts, numbers, and statistics to add clarity to your story. However, always explain what that number means and why the reader should care.



#### People are important

Frame the science in the bigger picture. Why does your story matter? Scientific stories involve people, so tell us about them.



#### Science is cool!

Don't forget we're inviting people to discover insanely cool ideas. Reflect your enthusiasm in your writing!
