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Neurolumen is FDA cleared, FDA clearance #K142025. Neurolumen is approved through the Central Office and is on the GSA schedule. We are currently finalizing the needed documentation to be added to the formulary. Neurolumen is proven to relieve pain and increase circulation. Neurolumen combines low level lasers, LEDs and electrical stimulation in an easy to apply wrap that can be used on multiple areas simultaneously. Results can be seen in as little as one treatment. This powerful combination provides long lasting results.

When veterans were given a choice at the Muskogee, OK VAMC, with direct comparison to other modalities, 75% chose Neurolumen over all other modalities. The Department of Labor pays for the Neurolumen for injured Federal Workers and State Workers. Neurolumen does all the training, follow-up care, and insurance filing for the patients. Third party insurance companies are also covering the Neurolumen.
