I have to begin this month's letter with a word of thanks. As a congregation, you have provided tremendous support in our new start. Our attendance is at post-Covid highs, giving has been very generous, and we have been blessed by outstanding volunteer support. These first couple months, we intentionally kept an inward focus. They also are instilling spiritual habits with their girls, including regular readings from a Bible story book. Quinn is learning how to pray by practicing at mealtime and bedtime. It's so sweet to hear her say all the things she is thankful for!
