

Supplies:

- Froot Loops
- Lucky Charms marshmallows
 - elastic string
 - toothpick
 - tape
 - scissors



Step 1: Sort your cereal by color. This is a great activity for kids to practice their colors and their sorting skills!

Step 2: Wrap the elastic string around the toothpick a few times, then tape it in place. Then, cut the string according to the length you need. (The length will vary depending on who's wearing it and if you will make a necklace or a bracelet.)

Step 3: Run the toothpick through a marshmallow. Pull the marshmallow down to the bottom of the string, leaving a little space at the end for tying later. The toothpick will be sticky from the marshmallow, so I would recommend wiping it.

Step 4: String the colored cereal in any pattern you'd like. Use all the colors, just a few, or only 1...the possibilities are endless! Fill the string with cereal and marshmallows, leaving room at the end for tying.

Step 5: Cut the toothpick off, then tie the two ends of the string together. I like to double knot it.







Step 6: Wear your cereal jewelry and eat it at your own pace! Enjoy!

From the Desk of Demetria:

The Benefits of a Gratitude Huddle for Families

A Gratitude Huddle for families is a simple yet powerful way to connect, appreciate one another, and build a positive atmosphere at home. By taking a few minutes each day or week to share what you're thankful for, family members can strengthen emotional bonds and create a culture of appreciation. This practice is inspired by the research outlined in the article "How Gratitude Changes You and Your Brain" by Robert Emmons, a professor of psychology at the University of California, Davis, published by the Greater Good Science Center. The article demonstrates the positive impact of gratitude on mental health and relationships.

For example, a child might express gratitude for a parent's support during a challenging school project, while a parent could thank their child for helping set the table. Even small moments of gratitude, like appreciating a warm meal together, can make a big difference in fostering positivity. Creating a gratitude jar, where everyone adds a note each time they share something they're grateful for, can be a fun and interactive way to build these moments of connection.

Additional Ideas for Children:

- 1. **Gratitude Art:** Children can draw or color something that represents what they're thankful for and display it in the house as a visual reminder of the positivity shared.
- 2. **Gratitude Journal:** Encourage kids to write or draw what they're thankful for after each huddle, helping them reflect on and revisit their gratitude.
- 3. **Gratitude Tree:** Set up a paper tree where children add leaves with something they're grateful for written on them, growing over time as more gratitude is shared.

Additional Ideas for Parents:

- 1. **Gratitude Rituals:** Parents can create a special ritual, like lighting a candle or sharing a personal reflection, to set the tone for the Gratitude Huddle.
- 2. **Model Gratitude:** Parents can lead by example, sharing their own moments of gratitude to encourage their children to do the same.
- 3. **Appreciation Circles:** Parents can organize a rotating circle where each family member expresses appreciation for another, strengthening emotional bonds and kindness.

Practicing gratitude regularly helps families focus on the good in life, improving emotional well-being and creating lasting bonds.
