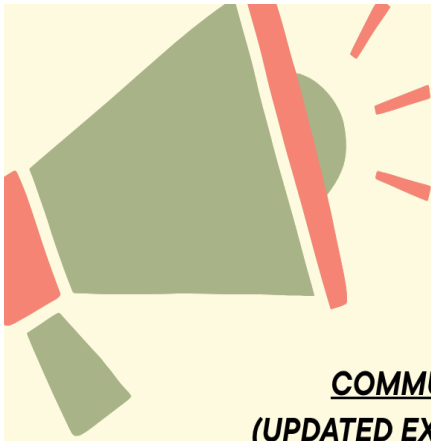

COMMUNITY CONNECTOR ACTIVITY GUIDANCE **(UPDATED EXPECTATIONS UNDER NEW STATE GUIDELINES)**

WE RECOGNIZE THAT THE RECENT CHANGES TO COMMUNITY CONNECTOR ACTIVITY GUIDELINES HAVE CREATED SIGNIFICANT CHALLENGES FOR BOTH PROVIDERS AND FAMILIES. MANY ACTIVITIES THAT WERE PREVIOUSLY COMMON—SUCH AS MUSEUMS, TRAMPOLINE PARKS, AND CERTAIN OUTINGS—ARE NOW RESTRICTED OR REQUIRE A DIFFERENT LEVEL OF STRUCTURE AND PURPOSE.

WE UNDERSTAND THAT PROVIDERS AND PARENTS ARE BOTH STRUGGLING TO ADJUST, AND WE WANT TO SUPPORT YOU BY OFFERING CLEAR, PRACTICAL EXAMPLES OF ACTIVITIES THAT FIT WITHIN THE UPDATED GUIDELINES WHILE STILL PROVIDING MEANINGFUL ENGAGEMENT FOR MEMBERS.

COMMUNITY CONNECTOR SERVICES MUST NOW FOCUS ON:

- ACTIVE PARTICIPATION
- SOCIAL INTERACTION WITH OTHERS
- SKILL DEVELOPMENT
- PUBLIC, COMMUNITY-BASED SETTINGS

COMMUNITY CONNECTOR ACTIVITY REQUIREMENTS

ALL COMMUNITY CONNECTOR ACTIVITIES MUST:

- BE ONE-TO-ONE (1:1) WITH THE MEMBER RECEIVING SERVICES
- TAKE PLACE IN PUBLIC SETTINGS OPEN TO THE COMMUNITY
 - ENCOURAGE INTERACTION WITH OTHERS
- SUPPORT COMMUNICATION, SOCIAL, OR INDEPENDENCE SKILLS

THE KEY EXPECTATION IS THAT THE MEMBER IS ACTIVELY PARTICIPATING AND ENGAGING, NOT SIMPLY PRESENT IN THE COMMUNITY.

APPROVED COMMUNITY CONNECTOR ACTIVITY IDEAS

THE FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES ARE GENERALLY APPROPRIATE WHEN THEY INCLUDE ACTIVE ENGAGEMENT AND INTERACTION.

LIBRARIES (HIGHLY RECOMMENDED)

LIBRARIES ARE ONE OF THE BEST OPTIONS UNDER THE NEW GUIDELINES.

EXAMPLES:

- STORY TIME WITH PARTICIPATION
 - ART OR CRAFT CLASSES
 - TEEN OR YOUTH GROUPS
 - READING OR ACTIVITY GROUPS
- INTERACTING WITH STAFF OR PEERS

⚠️ **IMPORTANT CLARIFICATION ABOUT VOLUNTEER ACTIVITIES**

VOLUNTEER ACTIVITIES MUST BE FORMAL, STRUCTURED, AND PART OF A RECOGNIZED ORGANIZATION OR PUBLIC PROGRAM.

🚫 THE FOLLOWING DO NOT QUALIFY:

- MOWING SOMEONE'S YARD
- HELPING A NEIGHBOR WITH CHORES
- DOING FAVORS FOR FRIENDS OR FAMILY
- ANY INFORMAL OR PRIVATE HELPING ACTIVITY

THESE DO NOT MEET THE DEFINITION OF COMMUNITY CONNECTOR SERVICES.

✓ APPROVED VOLUNTEER ACTIVITIES MUST:

- BE THROUGH AN ORGANIZED PROGRAM OR AGENCY
- BE OPEN TO THE COMMUNITY
- INCLUDE INTERACTION WITH OTHERS
- SUPPORT SKILL DEVELOPMENT



SOCIAL SKILL DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES

- YOUTH CLUBS
- GROUP PROGRAMS
- STRUCTURED PEER INTERACTION
- COMMUNITY CLASSES

INDEPENDENCE SKILL BUILDING

- PRACTICING COMMUNICATION IN PUBLIC

STRUCTURED PARK ACTIVITIES (WHEN DONE CORRECTLY)

- SUPERVISING PLAY ONLY

ACTIVITIES THAT DO NOT QUALIFY

THE FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES ARE NOT ALLOWED UNDER COMMUNITY CONNECTOR SERVICES:

- MUSEUMS (WHEN PASSIVE OR OBSERVATIONAL)
 - DINING OUT
 - SHOPPING TRIPS

PASSIVE ACTIVITIES

- WATCHING EVENTS
- SITTING IN PUBLIC SPACES WITHOUT INTERACTION
- ACTIVITIES WHERE THE MEMBER MAINLY OBSERVES

PRIVATE OR RESTRICTED ACTIVITIES

- PRIVATE EVENTS
- INVITATION-ONLY GATHERINGS
- ACTIVITIES NOT OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

TYPICAL PARENTING / SUPERVISION TASKS

- SUPERVISING CHILDREN AT A PARK
- HELPING A CHILD CROSS THE STREET
 - MONITORING SAFETY
- SUPERVISING PLAYDATES
- ROUTINE CHILDCARE



AGE-APPROPRIATE ACTIVITY GUIDANCE

COMMUNITY CONNECTOR SERVICES MUST ALSO BE DEVELOPMENTALLY APPROPRIATE.

YOUNGER CHILDREN

COMMUNITY CONNECTOR SERVICES ARE RARE FOR VERY YOUNG CHILDREN, AS THEY TYPICALLY REQUIRE PARENTAL SUPERVISION AS PART OF NORMAL DEVELOPMENT. SERVICES ARE GENERALLY APPROVED ONLY WHEN THERE ARE SIGNIFICANT NEEDS BEYOND TYPICAL DEVELOPMENT.

SCHOOL-AGE CHILDREN

EXAMPLES:

- LIBRARY PROGRAMS
- RECREATION CLASSES
 - YOUTH CLUBS
- STRUCTURED GROUP ACTIVITIES

TEENS AND YOUNG ADULTS

EXAMPLES:

- VOLUNTEER WORK
- SOCIAL CLUBS
- COMMUNITY PROGRAMS
- INDEPENDENCE SKILL DEVELOPMENT
- TRANSPORTATION TRAINING

KEY REMINDER FOR PROVIDERS

INSTEAD OF ASKING:

✗ “WHERE CAN I TAKE THE MEMBER?”

ASK:

✓ “WHAT SKILL ARE WE WORKING ON, AND WHERE CAN WE PRACTICE IT IN THE COMMUNITY?”

WE ARE HERE TO SUPPORT YOU

WE UNDERSTAND THAT THESE CHANGES HAVE CREATED REAL CHALLENGES FOR PROVIDERS AND FAMILIES. MANY PREVIOUSLY COMMON ACTIVITIES ARE NO LONGER ALLOWED, AND IT TAKES TIME TO ADJUST.

PLEASE REMEMBER:

- YOU ARE NOT EXPECTED TO FIGURE THIS OUT ALONE
- PPRS IS ACTIVELY WORKING ON SOLUTIONS AND IDEAS
- CASE COORDINATORS CAN ASSIST WITH SERVICE ADJUSTMENTS

Easy Easter Chocolate Chip Cookies

1. Combine the melted butter, brown sugar and granulated sugar in a mixing bowl. Stir with a wooden spoon {or electric mixer} to combine.
2. Add the dry ingredients all at once to the butter mixture. Stir until you have a thick dough.
3. Add chocolate chips to the cookie dough.
4. Stir the chocolate chips into the dough with a spoon.
5. Use a medium cookie scoop {or about 1.5 tablespoons} to scoop the cookie dough into your hand and roll. Place the cookie dough balls on a silicone mat {or parchment paper} lined baking sheet.
6. Bake cookies in a 350 degree oven for 9-11 minutes or until the cookies are set {but not over baked}. Remove from the oven.
7. While the cookies are baking, cut 22-24 chocolate coated candies in half.
8. To make an M&M Easter bunny, immediately after you remove the baked cookies from the oven add two whole M&M candies to the top of the cookies. Then place two of the same colored candy halves cut side down to form ears. Allow the cookies to cool completely on the cookie sheet
