

## Key Service Comparisons

Service	EBD Waiver	SLS Waiver	DD Waiver
<b>Personal Care</b>	Hands-on assistance with daily tasks like grooming and cleaning.	Assistance with daily living tasks, including prompting.	Similar to SLS, but may require more extensive support for those with severe needs.
<b>Respite Care</b>	Short-term relief for caregivers, provided in home or in facilities.	Short-term relief for caregivers, typically in the home.	Short-term relief for caregivers, often provided in the community.
<b>Adult Day Services / Day Habilitation</b>	Community-based services for social and health needs.	Supports skill development like socialization and daily living in community settings.	Offers structured activities aimed at skill acquisition and community participation.
<b>Professional Services</b>	Services provided by licensed professionals as needed.	Services provided by certified professionals for medical/behavioral needs.	Includes specialized services related to a person's disability.
<b>Homemaker Services</b>	Household tasks to maintain a safe, healthy environment.	Household tasks based on disability needs, like extra cleaning or laundry.	Similar to SLS, but focused on supporting independent living.
<b>Home Modifications</b>	Up to \$10,000 for home accessibility.	Up to \$10,000 for accessibility adaptations.	Similar to SLS, with a \$10,000 maximum lifetime benefit.
<b>Non-medical Transportation</b>	Transport to non-medical services like shopping, therapy, etc.	Transportation for services like Day Habilitation, social outings.	Transport to Day Habilitation or employment services.

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<b>Vehicle Modification</b>	Not typically covered.	Modifications to vehicles to accommodate special needs.	Similar to SLS, for independence and safety.
<b>Assistive Technology</b>	Devices to help with daily tasks or safety.	Technology to increase independence and functionality.	Similar to SLS but may include more specialized needs.
<b>Supported Employment</b>	Not a typical service provided.	Job placement and support to maintain employment in the community.	Job placement and ongoing support for individuals with developmental disabilities.
<b>Residential Habilitation</b>	Not applicable, as it's generally for those needing lower levels of support.	Not applicable, but some may live in shared housing arrangements.	Intensive residential support, often in group homes or family care settings.
<b>In-Home Support Services (IHSS)</b>	Allows participants to direct who provides their care and the type of care.	Not typically available under this waiver.	Not typically available under this waiver.
