Whenever Gary, Miss Elsie, and I travel back to North Carolina to visit family, one of the things we like to do is read church signs. Some are informative and advertise worship times or upcoming events. Some are humorous; "Our Church is Like Fudge, Sweet with a Few Nuts" or "God Shows No Favoritism, But Our Church Sign Guy Does...GO RAVENS!" One of my favorite funny church signs was at a church that was next door to a school where people were constantly speeding, "Jesus Sees Everything-but the Police Have Radar." Others share encouraging words that are meant to make the reader ponder the message, "What Does God Want For Christmas? Look in the Mirror."

Recently, I saw a church sign that made me ponder; "Prepare for Christmas. Come to Church." Many of us get wrapped up in preparing for Christmas by decorating the house, shop ping for that perfect gift, or anticipating company and travel. As someone who loves all the Christmas decorations, gift buying, and hospitality the season brings, I understand the pull of this kind of preparation. However, preparing for Christmas as a Christian means we are preparing our hearts for Jesus in order to receive and share the gifts of hope, peace, love, and joy. When we "come to church" we strengthen our relationships with one another, share ideas on how to reach our community in the name of Jesus, solve problems, and experience the grace and love of God through the sacrament of Holy Communion. In other words, when we "come to church" we learn how to "be the church."

Preparing for Christmas means we wait, we prepare, we watch, we ponder, we reflect. We also come to church not only on Christmas Eve and Easter or communion Sunday. Not only on the days we have a job to do or something special is happening. We prepare for Christmas by regularly attending church throughout the year and participating in the life of our faith community. We prepare for Christmas by coming to church and being the church. So Taylorsville... here's your sign...

"Come to Church and Be the Church."

Here at Taylorsville UMC we will be preparing for Christmas as we observe Advent by making Advent Wreaths, lighting the Advent Candles each Sunday in Advent, and hearing the Advent message of hope, peace, love, and joy. We will share the blessings we have received by taking envelopes from Tree of Hope for the missions we support. On Christmas Eve we will prepare for Christmas Day by lighting the Christ candle and singing "Silent Night, Holy Night" as we share the "Light" at the Candlelight Service. I pray each of you will be able to come to church and experience the **Hope, Peace, Love and Joy** of Christ as you prepare for Christmas-come to church, and be the church.

- 1. Pray for attentiveness to what truly matters, without being distracted by trivial things.
- 2. Pray for opportunities to learn something new regularly.
- 3. Pray for discernment of how God would like you to set your priorities and the ability to focus on them consistently to fulfill His purposes in your life.
- 4. Pray for the grace to be able to rest, become aware of God's presence, and enjoy it.
- 5. Pray for strong relationships with other people in the bond of loving community.
- 6. Pray for peace in all situations, no matter what the circumstances.
- 7. Pray for an enlivened imagination that helps you contribute to the world in creative ways.
- 8. Pray for freedom from all that burdens you past mistakes, fears, destructive habits, hurts other people have inflicted, and more.
- 9. Pray for joy and a sense of humor.
- 10. Pray for confidence in God's love for you and trust in His power to work things out for the best in your life.
- 11. Pray for a clear mind and the ability to clearly communicate what you value to others.
- 12. Pray for purity so you can grow as a person and encounter God more fully.
- 13. Pray for openness to the Holy Spirit's guidance.
- 14. Pray for a genuine awareness of God's grace in your life and the humility to extend grace to others.

Our Love For God, the title of this quarter's studies, can be a rather humbling subject. While the Lord's love is "everlasting" (Jeremiah 31:3), ours is inconsistent and "neverlasting". Still, the command to love God is, as Jesus stated, "the first and greatest commandment" (Matthew 22:36-38). Lessons this quarter are drawn from both the Old and New Testament, since loving God is seen throughout Scripture as humanity's principle response to God. It is only fitting that this quarter begins by studying the passage where the original command to love God is found: Deuteronomy 6:4-5. The Israelites were preparing to enter the land promised to them by God when Moses spoke his farewell address that makes up the book of Deuteronomy. Joshua spoke his own farewell address to the Israelites who had entered the land and triumphed over the residents there. He challenged God's people to discard any gods that remained among them, and he made his own choice unmistakably clear: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord" (Joshua 24:15).

Lesson three is taken from the book of Psalms, the collection of songs that express God's love for us and our reciprocal love for him. Psalm 103 encourages us not to forget the Lord's abundant blessings.

Our love for God takes on a whole new meaning when we come to the New Testament. And why shouldn't it? Here we see, as did Simeon, the salvation brought about by the Lord's Messiah (Luke 2:26, 30). This is the focus of lesson 4, which falls on the Sunday before Christmas Day. Lesson five, the final study of the year, challenges us to love God in a manner befitting such a marvelous gift - by calling us to loving acts that demonstrate our love of Jesus.


