

### **Vision Team Update**

For the past several months, the Vision team has been meeting to study and discern a new vision for Taylorsville Church.

We have examined the history of the Church, the surveys we established late last year, and the trends in our surrounding area, while also seeking discernment of God's calling. We are now developing a new vision statement for the Church.

The goal is that this vision will help guide our ministries, activities, and programs as we seek to grow the Church and stay relevant in the community around us. For this to work, we need to know that the vision we develop is right for Taylorville Church. Part of that is discerning where God is guiding us and how the Church itself wants to move.

We have identified some core principles that we believe are right for our Church.

Community engagement and building.

Faithful witness to the love of God.

However, we would like your input again to determine if these values and the statement we are writing are suitable for us.

The statement we currently have is as follows:

## "We seek to faithfully display God's love through our actions toward others in our community."

Before we adopt this statement as a guiding principle for our ministries, we would like your input. However, please note that statements like this are not permanent. This statement is to guide us through our time as we seek to grow in God's guidance and strength.

Our fall quarter, beginning in September, will focus on how God, through prophets and other leaders, gave help and guidance to the people of Judah. We will start with the prophetic ministry of Isaiah -his call and witness. While most kings of Judah and Israel earn bad grades from the writers of Kings and Chronicles, two seventh-century kings of Judah are revealed as seeking the Lord and reforming worship. King Hezekiah celebrates Passover according to what was written in the law of Moses, while King Josiah is a "by-the-book strategist" who sought proper obedience to the Lord.

The destruction of the temple, according to Scripture, was the result of social injustice, moral decay, and conventional disobedience. Isaiah finds a spark of hope in the devastation – the prophetic suffering of the people has a redemptive purpose, testifying to God's judgment and restoration. Near the end of the Babylonian exile, the prophet envisages a humiliated and afflicted servant who carries the sins of many.

We meet in the social hall on Sunday mornings. Beginning in September our start time changes to 8:45. Please consider joining us.

Each podcast is associated with additional reference information such as topic summaries, essays, and frequently asked questions. All is original material not copied from any source.

### The Curriculum: (Total 83 Podcasts)

- The Early Worship of Jesus (17 Podcasts)
- James The Brother of Jesus (12 Podcasts)
- The Nature of Reality, Is There A Place For God? (15 Podcasts)
- Does Modern Science Support A Spiritual Worldview? (8 Podcasts)
- The Mind of GOD (4 Podcasts, More To Come)
- A History and Interpretation of Second Isaiah (7 Podcasts)
- Apocalyptic Imagination: Jewish Apocalyptic Literature (1 Podcast, More To Come)

Each class is centered around a podcast (average of 30 minutes) with additional support material. Each class has a cited reference source for people who want more information. I have personally curated every source for academic accuracy and appropriateness.

Since I have not used any original material from the sources, no copyrights are violated and all sources used are cited just like any academic publication.


