## Sherri 's Sharings

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On Sunday, April 21st we will celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ! This will be a wonderful celebration as we remember the sacrifice of Jesus our Lord and the amazing grace of God. We are blessed to have three opportunities to celebrate the wonderful grace of God's forgiveness on Easter Sunday here at Taylorsville United Methodist Church.

Our Son Rise Service begins at 6:30 am on the lawn in front of the Ed. Building. There will be a yummy breakfast following the Son Rise Service. Later that morning we will continue to worship and praise God as we lift our hearts and hands to God during the Praise Service at 9:00 am and the Traditional Service at 11:00 am. We all get excited about Easter Sunday and all the celebrations that occur on Easter. However.....have you ever considered what happens as we lead up to Easter?

Holy Week is a time to prepare our hearts for the grace and love of Easter. So how do we prepare? We enter into a week made "holy" forever by the self-surrendering love of Jesus - for us all.

During Holy Week, we remember how God loved us. Whatever we do, no matter how busy or distracted we might be, we can let the power of Holy Week be in the background of our daily reflections. God as Jesus entered into our life - with its profound joys and its punishing evils - that we might never experience those struggles alone. So no matter what we experience this week, we can let it become a "holy" week, letting it all be touched by the graces of this week. From the humble, yet triumphant, entry into Jerusalem, to our standing together at the foot of his cross, this can be a week which helps us bring all of the elements of our lives, all our experiences of sin and death, into the font of his redeeming, liberating death and resurrection.

This past week I was talking to a few pastor friends about Holy Week. Each of us lamented that even though Easter is "late" this year, it seems like we have not had enough time to prepare. However, there is something very special about being part of all the worship events in a fast-paced week, leading to the resurrection.

On Maundy Thursday in Holy Week we celebrate the Last Supper Jesus shared with his friends. It also invites us to witness Jesus sweating blood as he prayed in the garden as those he trusted to pray with him dozed off. We also experience the painful betrayal of Jesus by Judas as he kissed Jesus. We will be having a service to remember this last meal Jesus had with his friends and how Christ invites us "to do this in remembrance."

Good Friday offers a sense of helplessness as we see Christ whipped, beaten, and carrying a heavy cross through the streets of Jerusalem. We can hear the nails being pounded into his wrists and feet as he gasps his last breath and says, "It is finished." On Good Friday, we strip the altar. It is a solemn and holy act of faith.

In the **busy-ness** of our daily lives, it is easy to skip the sacredness of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. After all, aren't we waiting for Easter? We want to focus on the joy...not the pain. However, there is pain in our world and people we love are looking for comfort and assurance in the midst of their pain.

This year, I hope you will consider participating in our observations for Holy Week at TUMC. If you need a ride, please let me or the office know.

- **Psalm Sunday**: April 14: Easter Praise at 9:00 service. Easter Cantata at 11:00 service, **Potluck, Easter Egg Hunt:** details to be announced soon
- **Stations of the Cross:** Thursday, April 18<sup>th</sup>: 10:00 am 6:30 pm. This is a reflective meditation. This is not a formal service, but instead it is a spiritual journey with Christ to the cross. It is a self-directed devotion. The Stations of the Cross will be located in the Fellowship Hall.
- Maundy Thursday Service (with Holy Communion): Thursday, April 18, 7:00 pm
- **Good Friday Service**: Friday, April 19, 7:00 pm. Good Friday is the time we remember the sacrifice Christ made for us. Easter becomes "just another holiday" when we forget to reflect on and remember the depth of pain and suffering Jesus endured on our behalf.
- **Son Rise Service** April 21: Service will begin at 6:30 am on the lawn of the Ed. Building. Breakfast will follow.
- **Easter Sunday** April 21: Praise Service at 9:00 am; Traditional Service at 11:00 am. BRING A FRIEND!

Holy Week and Easter are prime times to invite a friend to worship with us. It is also a great time to reaffirm your faith in Christ Jesus by attending the special services. My prayer is that each of you will know the abundant love of God throughout this Lenten Season, throughout Holy Week, and into Easter and beyond!

I love you and God loves you more...and there is nothing you can do about it!





### **Easter Story Cookies**

1 c. whole pecans 1 tsp. vinegar 3 egg whites pinch of salt 1 c. sugar

zipper baggie wooden spoon Bible

Preheat oven to 300°. This is important. Don't wait until you're

half done with the recipe. Place pecans in zipper baggie and let children beat them with the wooden spoon to break into small pieces. Explain that after Jesus was arrested He was beaten by the Roman soldiers. Read John 19:1-3. Let each child smell the vinegar, then put into mixing bowl. Explain that when Jesus was thirsty on the cross He was given vinegar to drink. Read John 19:28-30. Add egg whites to vinegar. Eggs represent life. Explain that Jesus gave His life to give us life. Read John 10:10-11. Sprinkle a little salt into each child's hand. Let them taste it and brush the rest into the bowl. Explain that this represents the salty tears shed by Jesus' followers, and the bitterness of our own sin. Read Luke 23:27. So far, the ingredients are not very appetizing. Add 1 cup of sugar. Explain that the sweetest part of the story is that Jesus died because He loves us. He wants us to know and belong to Him. Read Psalms 34:8 and John 3:16. Beat with a mixer on high speed for 12 to 15 minutes until stiff peaks are formed. Explain that the color white represents the purity in God's eyes of those whose sins have been cleansed by Jesus. Read Isaiah 1:18 and John 3:1-3. Fold in broken nuts. Drop by teaspoons onto wax paper-covered cookie sheet. Explain each mound represents the rocky tomb where Jesus' body was laid. Read Matthew 27:57-60. Put the cookie sheet in the oven, close the door and turn off the oven. Give each child a piece of tape and seal the oven door. Explain that Jesus' tomb was sealed. Read Matthew 27:65-66. Go to bed! Explain that they may feel sad to leave the cookies in the oven overnight. Jesus' followers were in despair when the tomb was sealed. Read John 16:20 and 22. On Easter morning, open the oven and give everyone a cookie. Notice the cracked surface and take a bite. The cookies are hollow! On the first Easter, Jesus' followers were amazed to find the tomb open and empty. Read Matthew 28:1-9.
