

Little White Methodist Church Seventy-five years ago upon a hill, I came to the town of Taylorsville. Just married and came here to be, a member of the Methodist Church you see. Don't remember a lot about it then. My Mother-in-law I drove to the end Of old muddy Bradock Road and parked, We walked out to church happy as larks. I helped out at church everything I could, There was a cookstove in the basement that burned wood. There was no bathroom or kitchen or water at all, We decided to have supper Spring and Fall. We brought up *water* in be milk cans, and washed dishes in tin dish pans. Brought big sacks of corncobs from Forever Farm, To burn them really wasn't any harm. Had an oyster supper in the Fall, It really was not much trouble at all. I stood at the stove and fed it cobs. Mrs. Farver fried oysters was her job. I think the suppers then were twenty-five cents, We made enough money to buy a fence. In front of the graveyard on the left side see, Then planted a row of beautiful trees. And in the Spring what a wonderful sight, Gorgeous pink dogwood trees without a blight, And now many years later what a wonderful sight, Than those beautiful dogwoods so bright. At our little white Methodist church on the hills, I'll love I forever and always will


Stay or Go: Real Talk for United Methodists Exploring Their Future

Taylorsville UMC is seeking a part-time Worship Music Director. The primary duty would be to build and direct a praise band and a traditional choir. The successful candidate must be able to play the piano and hopefully another instrument, preferably a guitar.
