

### IT'S STILL THE GREATEST STORY EVER TOLD

**Christmas: The Story of His Love** 

Dear Fellowship of Taylorsville United Methodist Church:

It is my honor on behalf of the Choir to provide this article addressing this holiday season. On Christmas Eve morning, December 24, 2023, at 10:00 AM, our Choir will share with you in music the greatest story ever told. From an historical perspective, Israel had heard rumors of a great event involving a promised Messiah. The event had been foretold for hundreds of years by prophets inspired by Jehovah God.

For as much as 400 years before His coming, God's people had only known silence with no reassuring words from their religious leaders to calm their anxieties and fears. The people were struggling under heavy suppression and personal fear for their very lives. Their continued expectations of a Messiah would hopefully give them relief and a renewed hope. No prophet or king had shown them a more immediate realization of their hopes and dreams – a promised Messiah to relieve them of their suppression and fears. The people prayed, offered sacrifices, and continued with their religious festivals and holy days. But even with all these, there remained only silence and waiting.

The time finally arrived! But this time and event when manifested was far from what the people had expected. They anticipated a revolution led by God's Messiah against the ruthless rulers. This did not occur, or at least if it could be called a revolution, it did not occur in the manner the people had hoped. After their liberation from captivity in Egypt and all the miraculous events in their 40-year wanderings, they yearned for something more spectacular. But what they got was a barely noticeable birth of a small baby in a lowly stable of all places.

But God's promises are not to be ignored. Even with the people's unfaithfulness to a God who had given them everything, they still did not turn universally to Jesus. After more than 2,000 years, many people still are not turning to Jesus. They remain divided over the full meaning of His coming and are questioning His message of salvation. Even though the message is clearly one of love and hope.

Our Choir will address this miraculous message of love and hope in the cantata this year – "Christmas: The Story of His love." We encourage all our membership to bring their family and their friends on December 24 at 10:00 AM to hear this message. And keep in mind that throughout all time, this message of hope and love still awakens each year in Bethlehem and throughout the entire world.




## **ADVENT STUDY** - The Angels of Christmas
