The days are getting shorter now. As we count down the days until Christmas, we experience more and more darkness each say until December 21, the "longest night". It's the time of year when the more primitive parts of our brains are telling us to store fat for the winter and to get extra rest. I often joke that I feel like it's time to hibernate. And our cultural heritages certainly don't help. How many of us have passed down low-calorie Christmas cookie recipes and other healthy eating habits around the holidays? It's just not part of our tradition. And that's ok. Go ahead and enjoy a cookie or two, as long as your healthcare professional says it's ok.

We have other traditions we have passed down over the decades and centuries as well, some traditions being older than others. In cultures all over the northern hemisphere the month of December is a time for lighting candles or, in more modern times, small electric lights that sometimes look like candles, to shine light into the darkness. Our Jewish brothers and sisters light the candles of the menorah to remind them of the eight nights the oil lasted as they celebrate Hanukkah. Our friends from African decent light candles as they celebrate Kwanza. Two lesser known holidays Yalda and Yule, celebrated by Zoroastrians and people of Scandinavian decent (and also by those who are Wiccan or Pagan) are celebrated around the winter solstice and involve not just simple candles, but entire fires and bonfires.

But for us, we have light in three significant ways. First, we light candles on the advent wreath – this helps us count down the weeks until Christmas. Next, we have the "light of the world", Jesus himself, who comes on Christmas to shine into all of our lives. Finally, we have the "Star of wonder", the star which guided the wise men to find Jesus and his earthly family so long ago.

So don't let the darkness get you down (and if it does, come to the Blue Christmas on Dec. 21st). Light some extra candles and let the "babe in the manger", as St. Francis of Assisi called the Christ child, in. Take a break from the hustle of preparing for the holiday season and just gaze into the glow of a candle or the twinkle of the lights on a Christmas tree. Use that time to reflect on the light that came to dwell among us so long ago and give God praise for the most precious gift of all time. Then join us on Christmas Eve for one more tradition that involves candles, as we all sing Silent Night together while holding our candles and celebrating that amazing gift. I hope to see you and your family then.





Honor means fame earned, recognition based on merit. More than any human being, God has earned his fame. The winter quarter is designed to explore how the Bible teaches us to express honor to God.

People often honor God with their lips without their hearts being in it. Four lessons from 1 Chronicles 15-17 reveal that David's praise of God was not superficial or self-serving, but truly came from his heart. King Saul was not an honorable man and placed his own ambition before honoring God. One way this was shown was in how he all but ignored the ark of the covenant. In contrast, David made arrangements for moving the ark to Jerusalem and even expressed a desire to build it a permanent home.

In a song that rivals David's own for beauty, Mary celebrated being given the honor of becoming the Messiah's mother. True honor will always be an expression of inner character.


Join us as we study these lessons illustrating how David and Mary honored God.
