We are all People of God

Paul's Letter to the Corinthians was written in part to deal with a divided church. The letter is addressed to those who are "called to be saints" and then proceeds to ask us to consider our behavior in light of this call. In this season of Epiphany or the "little ordinary time" of our lectionary calendar, we will follow Paul's letter and his advice for the church then and now.

Our causes for division may not be the same, but we can certainly relate to a divided church, and even a divided nation. As we journey together through his letter to the church in Corinth, we will explore how our unique diversity, our unique perspectives are a blessing to the church, even though they can present challenges to dialogue. We will see how focusing on our common love and devotion to Christ helps keep us connected and can help us focus our ministry on both growing our own faithfulness as disciples, but also on inviting others to join in our walk of faith.

As much as we like to say we are all one in Christ (which is true), we are also quite diverse. Ignoring our differences might seem to be the easy way to get along, but it actually is cowardly and can cause deep seeded resentment and harm our relationship with one another. Instead, it is best to learn about the blessing of the diverse ways in which God created each of us, the unique gifts we are each blessed to have, and then figure out how those gifts complement one another so we can move forward together to be a blessing for others, with the triune God as our guide and guardian.

So join us on Sundays as we explore the series Somos del Señor (We are of God). Make time to have a conversation with a neighbor or co-worker who has a different background or perspective from you. Learn to see how God is working in them and how their unique story fits into God's great story, just like yours does. Because together, we are all the people of God.

If you are interested in becoming a Children's Sunday School teacher we have openings! Please contact the church office.




