# Happy New Year

Like many people, New Year's is usually a secular holiday. It is a time to watch fireworks and sing 'Auld Lang Syne' as people on the TV carry on with a crystal ball in Times Square. I confess I have spent most New Year's at home in bed before the year rolls over. Though I'm not opposed to a fun gathering to ring in the new year, I don't usually consider New Year's a particularly religious or faithful holiday.

However, in some churches and throughout Methodist history, people have gathered for worship. Methodists often treat the new year as an opportunity to renew their commitment to God and each other. John Wesley used to advocate for a new year's covenant renewal service. Congregations would gather to welcome the new year and refresh their commitment to being a faith community with prayers for unity and dedication to God. If you want to know what it might look like, look up the 'Covenant Renewal Prayer' in our worship resources.

In African American churches, gathering for New Year's takes on additional meaning. The watch night service is a vigil commemorating a milestone in ending slavery. The emancipation proclamation came into law at midnight as 1862 turned over into 1863. It's an opportunity to remember past achievements while looking forward to the promise of a new tomorrow.

However you celebrate, remember that the New Year brings new opportunities; whether you plan to make a significant personal resolution, let this year be the time to create a new approach to life and faith. If you found that last year left you with too much pessimism and negativity, start this year with a fresh new attitude and spirit. Remember the advice we find in Ephesians.

"You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; to be made new in the attitude of your minds; and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness" (Ephesians 4:22-24).

However you welcome the New Year, let's recommit ourselves to renew ourselves and our faith. If you feel called to do something in God, take the opportunity to respond this year. This year is a great time to start if you want to deepen your faith. If you want to start that new Bible study or fellowship group, now is your time. And if you have no plans for the new year, that's okay. Let God guide you, and your year will be filled with fresh grace.

May God bless us all with a new year and inspiration to be the church shaped in Jesus' name. Amen.


