EASTER: THE STORY OF REDEMPTION (A Message from Your Choir)

Easter and Lent are momentous times in the year for Christians everywhere in our world. The season presents occasions for just about every emotion in the human spectrum. Just as Christmas seems to be most characterized by joy, Easter goes much further and deeper with our emotions, and prods our minds and hearts fully about our Christian experience. Easter when fully experienced answers the all-important question in our lives: "What's it all about anyhow?" And if one knows Christ Jesus fully, that question is easily answered. The answer for anyone includes the assurance of a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

It is this whole issue of the resurrection that permeates our Easter experience. Easter each year renews our hope, emphasizes the promises we hold so dear, and shows us that while death has some finality in this life, death as a Christian moves us very assuredly into a new life in glory with Christ Jesus and all the saints.

We are reminded regularly of the power of faith and the importance of the resurrection. In the early 1700s, Samuel Wesley, father of John Wesley, wrote some very powerful words and poetic lyrics. The following lyrics came to be published in John Wesley's hymnbook "A Collection of Psalms and Hymns" in the year 1737.

Behold the Savior of mankind nailed to the shameful tree; How vast the love that Him inclined to bleed and die for thee! Hark how He groans, while nature shakes, and earth's strong pillars bend! The temple's veil in sunder breaks, the solid marbles rend.

'Tis done! The precious ransom's paid! "Receive My soul!", He cries; See where He bows His sacred head! He bows His head and dies! But soon He'll break death's envious chain and in full glory shine. O Lamb of God, was ever pain, was ever love like Thine?

These few simple lines aptly summarize what it's all about in our Christian life.

Our Choir will sing of His love, sacrifice and resurrection on Easter Sunday morning, March 31. All are encouraged to come and hear the beautiful lyrics as we present, "Easter: The Story of Redemption."




