Sherri 's Sharings

*During Lent, Lord, help us grow in faith, hope and love —
“and the greatest of these is love” (1 Corinthians 13:13)*

Greetings and Blessings Taylorsville Family!

Happy Lent...no that doesn't sound right. Merry Lent...wrong again! The season of Lent is a time of reflection and a period of examining one's faith walk through spiritual disciplines.

On Wednesday, March 6, we will begin the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday, or “Day of Ashes” is the beginning of the Lenten season. It is called Day of Ashes because of the practice of rubbing ashes on one's forehead in the sign of the cross. Since Lent is exactly 40 days (excluding Sundays), Ash Wednesday will always fall on Wednesday. There will never be Ash Monday or Ash Thursday. Here at Taylorsville we will be available from 6:00 AM to 1:00 PM for a reflective time with individual scripture, prayer and imposition of ashes. There will be a traditional service at 6:30 pm with the imposition of ashes.

The Bible never mentions Ash Wednesday or Lent. Most Catholics and some Protestants, including our United Methodist denomination, observe Ash Wednesday and Lent. The Eastern Orthodox Church does not observe Ash Wednesday; instead, they start Lent on “Clean Monday.” Lent is intended to be a time of self-denial, moderation, fasting, and forsaking sinful acts, vices, and habits. Ash Wednesday commences this period of spiritual discipline and commitment to Christ.

Although the Bible does not mention Ash Wednesday or Lent, it does record accounts of people in the Old Testament using dust and ashes of symbols of repentance and mourning (2 Samuel 13:19; Esther 4:1; Job 2:8, Daniel 9:3). The modern tradition of rubbing ashes in the sign of a cross on a person's forehead identifies that person with Jesus Christ.

Have you ever asked yourself if you should observe Ash Wednesday or Lent? For some people it seems too legalistic and isn't mentioned in scripture. The Bible never commands or condemns the practice; Christians are at liberty to prayerfully decide whether or not to observe Ash Wednesday and Lent. If you do decide to observe Ash Wednesday and Lent, it is important to have a biblical perspective. Jesus cautioned against making a show of our fasting. He said, “When you fast, do not look somber as the hypocrites do, for they disfigure their faces to show men they are fasting. I tell you the truth, they have received their reward in full. But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that it will not be obvious to men that you are fasting, but only to your Father, who is unseen” (Matthew 6:16-18). We must not allow spiritual discipline to become spiritual pride. It is a good thing to repent of sinful acts, but that's something Christians should do every day, not only during Lent. It's a good thing to clearly identify oneself as a Christian, a follower of Jesus Christ, but one should do this every day.

It is also good to remember that no ritual can make one's heart right with God. One is made right with God by accepting the amazing grace and forgiveness God offers freely everyday through the Son, Jesus Christ, and through the power of the Holy Spirit. Ash Wednesday and Lent can be a wonderful time of drawing closer to God through spiritual practices that we observe everyday.

I pray that during the Season of Lent as you meditate on your faith walk you will discover a deeper relationship with our Triune God through forgiveness and grace. Happy Lent, Merry Lent...no. Grace-filled Lent!






