### The Story of Christian Symbols told by Taylorsville UMC Stained Glass Windows Window Fourteen – The Church Name



In most cases naming anything takes quite a bit of thought, but window fourteen was a “no-brainer”. However, do you realize how many names this church has had in its 166 years of existence. Now, before you say Pastor Patty cannot do the correct math.....

*The stained-glass window over the front door. The only window that you can view from both sides without any of the picture being whited out. Although the letters are backwards from the inside. (Daylight view)*

.....(which actually, I have had wrong before because I thought the church was 143 years old) I am talking about the age of the church, not the building. The church started in 1855 and met in an old building called the band hall. The original name of the church was Taylorsville Methodist Episcopal Church. The next name change occurred in 1939 when three Methodist denominations united to form the Methodist Church. The church had split before the Civil War on the question of slavery and nearly 100 years later re-united. The final name change occurred in 1968 when the Methodist church merged with the Evangelical United Brethren Church (EUB), which caused the name to change to what it is today, Taylorsville United Methodist Church. The church name window was added to the stained-glass collection in 1986 when all the windows were removed and repaired to a condition that has made them last to this day. I am so glad I could get the two views so you can appreciate the vivid colors of the “name” window.

The window is a beautiful addition to the church and our name is proudly presented as a place, where for hundreds of years there have been hundreds of believers raising their voices in worship and praise of HIS name. Our beautiful house of God. “Come Ye Faithful People Come” – *Pastor Patty*




## Sermon Series for November 2021

- 6. Donations of oil, saltine crackers, money for oysters can be given to Sandy Wright or Susan Maring. Food items must be at church no later than Sunday, November 7. Oyster patters and kitchen help are needed the day of the bazaar. See Vivian Overholtzer.**
- 7. Baked goods should be at the church no later than 8:30 AM the day of the bazaar. Please note on items if they are sugar free, contain nuts, etc. There will be time on Friday to drop off also.**




