In October we continue looking at faithfulness. God unilaterally reveals himself as true, the God to whom we can take the risk of attaching our hopes. But the invitation requires that we begin to take steps to reciprocate that loyalty. Those steps don't make us worthy of his faithfulness but they show that we trust his faithfulness.

God expects us, his people, to practice faithfulness in our relationships with him. Moses uses the metaphor of a contract between a king and his people to show what the give-and-take of a faithful relationship between God and his people looks like. Later, a fugitive prophet and a starving widow are brought together by God. Together they learn to demonstrate faithfulness to God.

Join us in the social room at 9:50 as we work through this quarter - encouraged that our faithful God chooses to enter into a relationship with us that makes us more like him.

We continue our study this fall on Thursday mornings at 9:00 a.m. in the Education Building. We are studying Paul's second letter to the people of Corinth-2 Corinthians. The theme is "Remembering What Really Matters".



The Corinthians had strayed from the teachings and the Spiritual Health Check-up that Paul commended them for in his first letter. This letter reminds the Corinthians to turn from their worldly ways and to think and live in ways that honor God. We are open to new students of the Bible. Bring your Bible no matter which translation. We thrive on the different versions.



Focus on Samaritan's Purse 2019 Franklin Graham, President // Operation Christmas Child (OCC) Shoebox gifts collection on Nov 17, 2019 // Collecting shoeboxes after Bazaar at Taylorsville United Methodist Church.

Things to pack in a shoebox for a child at Christmas: A WOW toy, which could be a stuffed animal, doll, Nerf sports ball or toy cars. Other gifts like games, activity supplies, hygiene itemslike toothbrushes, comb or brush set, hair accessories, hats, socks, fun toys, cards, drawing pads, jacks, jumping ropes, yoyos or school supplies like pencils or pens. There are also age appropriate suggestions and ideas on the website by age category. The age categories are Boy and Girl in ages 2-4 yrs old, 5-9 yrs old, and 10-14 yrs old.

Please sponsor to ship an OCC shoebox by including \$9 shipping fee or pay \$9 online at above website. The \$9 per box helps to ship each box and other project costs. Then print and attach special tracking label to "follow your box(es)" (to learn later by email what location your OCC shoebox went to.) The boxes are shipped by Samaritan's Purse to more than 100 countries around the world.

There is also a ministry outreach program with Samaritan's Purse called "The Greatest Journey". This bible study is available on a voluntary basis for children, who receive an OCC shoebox. Each gift of just \$6 per child will provide teacher training, lesson booklets, materials, and a New Testament bible. A donation gift of \$90 will cover a class of 15 children. Over the past decade Samaritan's Purse has seen 9 million children make decisions for Christ (through the bible study provided free to them.) - 5. Kitchen donations of oil, saltine crackers, etc. should be at the church (downstairs kitchen) by Sunday, November 3. Monetary donations should be given to Sandy Wright, Susan Maring or Jean Knill. Just a note about the oystersthey cost approximately \$65 a gallon, we need 15 gallons, there are 3 patties per platter. That's a lot of oysters! Patters are also needed the day of the bazaar. 1/4 tsp pepper


1 10 1/2 oz. can (Campbells) Tomato Soup
