

The Story of Christian Symbols told by Taylorsville UMC Stained Glass Windows Window Twelve and Thirteen – The Corkrans



These two windows are probably mostly overlooked when compared to the larger and more colorful ones in the sanctuary, but they still represent a symbol of Christianity. They represent the faithful believers' tithers, leaders of the church, those that loved this little white Methodist church so much they donated an entire window and finally, all those that gave pennies and nickels to assist not only the original placement of the stained-glass windows but the restoration completed in 1986.

The above picture is all I could locate on Rev. Corkran, except for a small blurb in the "The Miracle Complete" booklet telling the story of the restoration.



"After the twelve windows in the Sanctuary and narthex were completed the two small windows over the back doors were restored and put into new wooden frames. These two windows were originally in the chancel and were given by Rev. and Mrs. C. H. Corkran. They were moved when the addition was completed in 1952." There is little known about the original placement of the windows, even the date. I wonder how they knew so much about these two small windows? He served TUMC from 1914-1916. Thank you so much Rev. Corkran, today we recognize you and all those responsible for our lovely windows.


Schedule:
